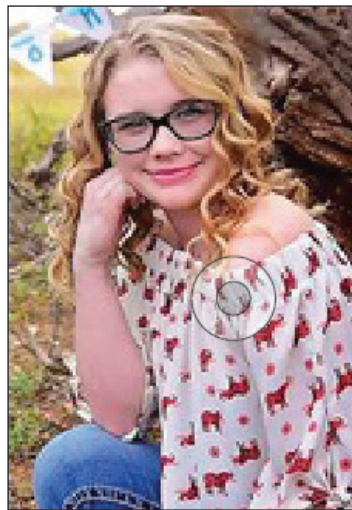
and Pam Hibler respectively presently hold these places on the board; each have filed for re-election.

MaKalli Marshall is the 17-year-old daughter of Mack & Crystal Marshall and Heather & Joe Bob Kinnaman. She is the Granddaughter of Maggie and Darrell Marshall and JoAnn and Chuck Jones of Flower Mound, Texas. She has participated in band, FFA, Wheeler Lady Stangs basketball manager and she is also the Wheeler Lion's Club Sweetheart. Kalli is planning on attending Southwestern Oklahoma State University and enrolling in the radiology program after graduation. After

completion of that program, MaKalli plans to continue her education at the University of North Texas in Dallas to get her doctorate in pediatric care.

In September 2017, MaKalli was diagnosed with hypertrophic cardiomyopathy (thickening of the wall in her heart). On January 25, 2019, MaKalli was placed on the heart transplant

list 1B status due to symptoms of heart failure. MaKalli and her parents must stay within two hours of Dallas while waiting for a donor. Post-surgery they will be required to live in Dallas for three months.

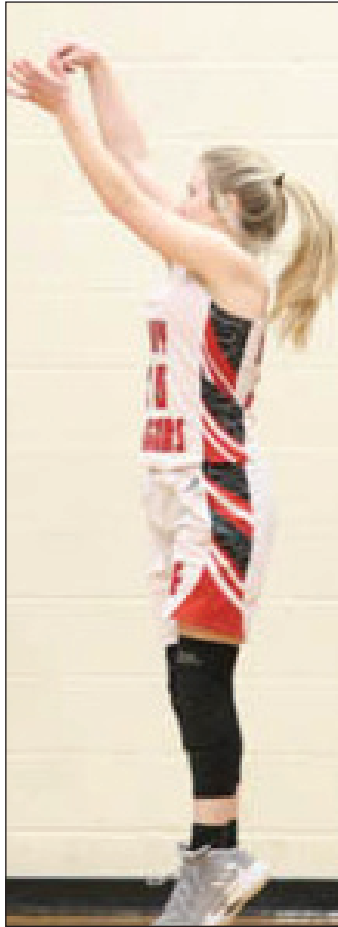

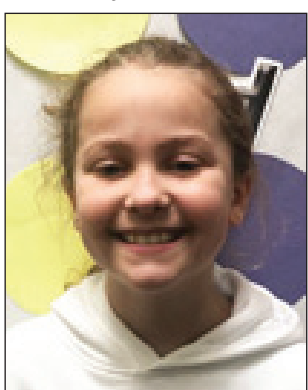

Wheeler County Stage One Burn Ban

Order Prohibiting or Restricting Outdoor Burning
WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court finds that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Wheeler County that all outdoor burning is prohibited in the unincorporated area of the county for 90 days from the date of adoption of this Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court. This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code Sec. 352.081, and other applicable statutes. This Order does not prohibit outdoor

burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for:

- Firefighter Training;
- Planting or harvesting of agricultural crops;
- Burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Sec. 153.048, Natural Resources Code, and meet the standards of Sec. 153.047, Natural Resources Code;
- Public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations;
- Welding is allowed by commercial/professional welders under the following guidelines only:

A spotter is required for each welder, each cutter, each grinder or for any activity that causes or may cause a spark. A diameter across the welding area shall be a minimum of 25 feet and clear of vegetation, if possible, and kept wet. The welding diameter must be three times the height of the actual welding. Example: if welding is occurring ten (10) feet off the ground, a diameter of thirty (30) feet must be protected.

A minimum of 200 gallons of pressured water must be available on site.

Each welding vehicle must have at least one (1) fully charged 10 lb. Class ABC chemical fire extinguisher on site.

If the work area cannot be cleared of vegetation, proper precautionary measures must be taken (example: protecting brush, etc., by utilizing fire resistant tarps).

Each site will have cellular telephone communications for emergency response.

Welding in an enclosed area is acceptable.

In accordance with Local Government Code Sec. 352.081(h), a violation of this Order is a Class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.

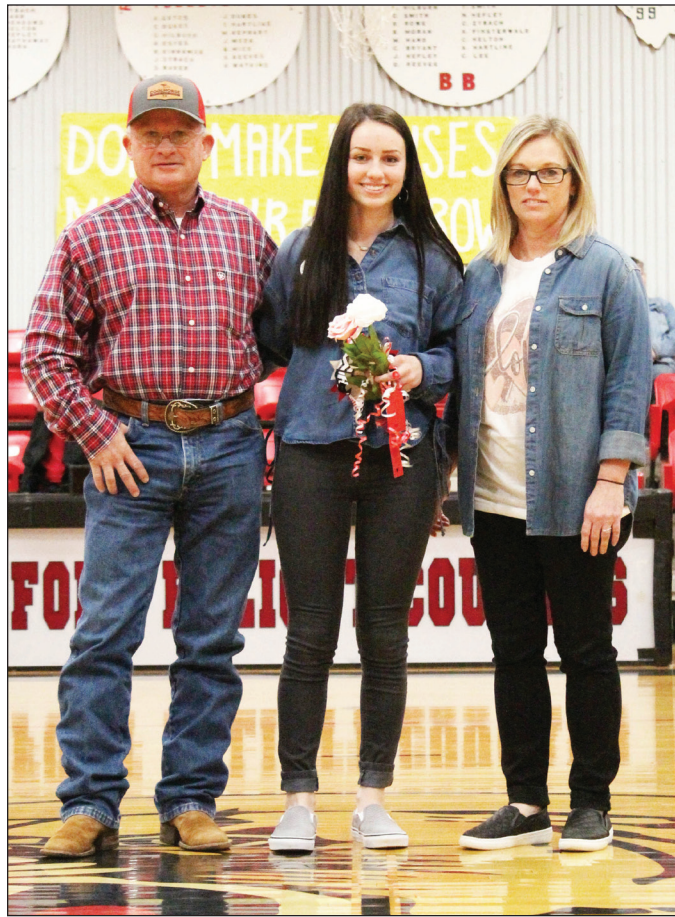

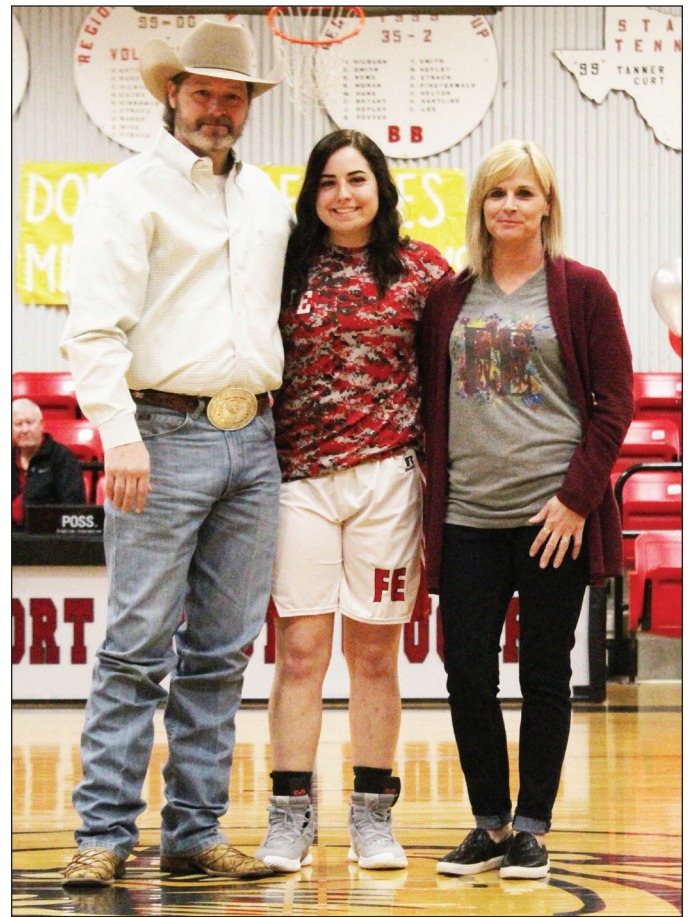

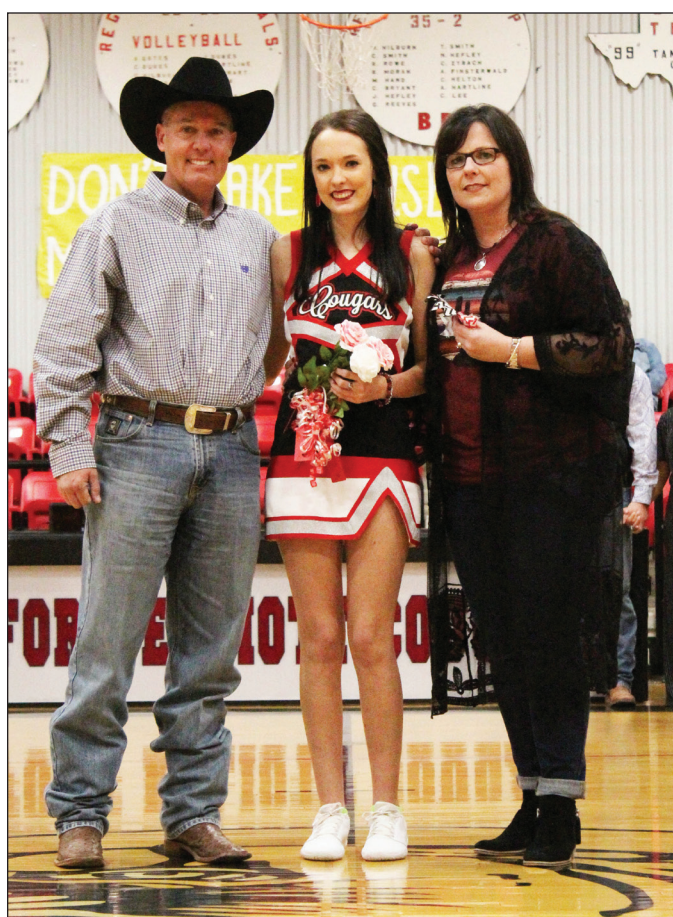
