out of a 3A high school."

Bratton has raised the standards of the group and the students have enjoyed rising to the challenge. In many cases, this gives the students a chance to help one another out and develop leadership skills along with honoring their musicianship.

"I've had so much fun in all 4 years of playing in band! I'm glad I could help the others with certain rhythms and be someone to go to for help," said senior percussionist, Josue Rincon.

In addition to the three prepared pieces, a new song is then passed out to the Band. Neither the director nor the students will be familiar with the song and after only a brief explanation period and no rehearsal time, the band must perform the song for a different panel of judges. This is a Sight Reading Contest and according to Bratton, this is the band equivalent of the STAAR test.

"You must prepare the students to be able to see and react very quickly," Bratton said. "There is a lot of pressure on them to use their brains and there are infinite combinations of information that they must be able to put together! I'm so proud of the skills they have developed and their ability to come together as a group to have a beautiful performance."

According to Bratton, the band does not technically compete against other bands at the U.I.L. contest, but rather against a standard—either a group can play the music or it cannot. Wheeler was one of only two schools in conference 2A to earn a First Division rating from every judge with the other being Panhandle High School.

"These guys work hard in my class day in and day out and it has really paid off for them these last few year," Bratton said. "Sometimes it's easy to give up and hard to try. Kids will come into the program and say that they have not musical ability, but after some effort, they turn out to be great musicians and hopefully learn more in the process. I'm really proud of these kids for sticking with it."

More importantly for Bratton though is the pride that the students have taken in their own accomplishments.

"I'm really happy with what we accomplished this year," said senior clarinetist, Angel Ontiveros. "I couldn't have asked for a better four years of band."

The students will now begin to prepare music for their annual Spring Concert, which is tentatively set for Thursday, May 2, 2019. Most of this will be different than what they have worked on for the contest because this will give the students additional goals and they are always ready to rise to new challenges and according to Bratton, that is what impresses him the most about his students.

"I'm thankful for such an amazing director to help everyone not just in band, but to become a better person in and outside of school," Rincon said. Hearing that student can learn life lessons on their way to success at U.I.L. competitions is surely music to their director's ears."

**FIRE DESTROYS LOCAL CHURCH:** A fire Saturday morning claimed one of Wheeler's oldest business buildings. The Iglesia Cristiana Canaan at the corner of Sweetwater and Oklahoma caught fire and was a total loss. It had the roof removed in the wind storm June 22, 2018. The building had a long history and served many purposes. It was built as a locker plant and housed a grocery. The cause was electrical. In the 40's William (Bill) Black (Mary Black Jones' grandfather) leased the building and operated the Wheeler Locker and Slaughter Plant, which offered locker space for people to store their meat. Also attached to the building was an ice plant, where locals could buy blocks of ice for their iceboxes. Later, the building became a grocery, maintained the locker and had a fresh meat counter. It was Pierce's Trading Post for a while and then was used for two different Spanish churches.
