MEANS, SPARKS, BLACKMON & URIBE EARN STATE FIRST DIV.

Four members of the Mustang Band earned medals at the UIL State Solo and Ensemble Contest on Monday, June 3rd in Austin.

Mac Means performed a solo and Will Blackmon, Nicholas Sparks, and David Uribe performed a trio at the event. These students earned a spot in the competition back in February by receiving First Divisions on their respective pieces at the Region Contest at WTAMU in Canyon.

"The amazing thing about these music competitions is that our guys compete against students from all classifications of schools in Texas and the students who make it to UIL State Solo and Ensemble contest are the best of the best in class A-6A" said Band Director John Bratton.

According to Bratton, the expectation at the State level is essentially a flawless performance and these students were up for the challenge.

The contest is judged by the most outstanding teachers in Texas and in the country. Many of the judges are college professors and some are professional musicians.

"I am very thankful that I was able to end my high school career on a "high note," literally and figuratively," said Senior French Horn player Mac Means who earned a gold medal by performing the third movement from 'Horn Con-

certo in B-flat Major' by Reinhold Gliere. "State Solo and Ensemble was a great experience for me each year that I went. I was able to meet many important people in the music world and grow as a musician."

This marked Means' third year to compete at the State Contest. As a Sophomore, Means earned a silver medal and as a Junior and Senior, he has brought home the gold. But according to Means, there is more value in his success than earning the medal: "The most rewarding part of the contest, however, was showing future students that band is a fruitful endeavor." This is a fitting sentiment as the other contestants from Wheeler were all Freshmen members of the Band.

"State Solo and Ensemble Contest was a great experience," said Freshman Baritone player Will Blackmon. "Our ensemble worked really hard and it was all worth it in the end."
