Dedication Set For Old Historical Tree

This mulberry tree has been recognized by the Texas Historic Tree Coalition as being more than 130 years old. Over the years this tree has become known as “the Temple Houston Tree”. It was planted by the youngest son of Sam Houston when he lived in Old Mobeetie as a memorial to his daughter.

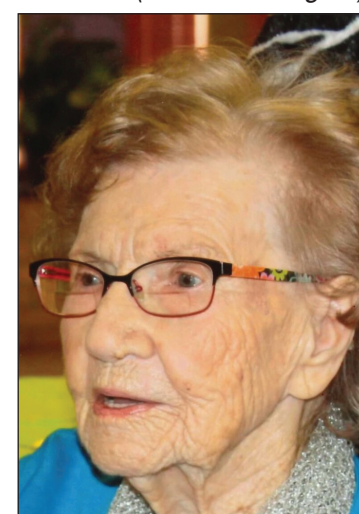
Wheeler Students Attend Band Camp

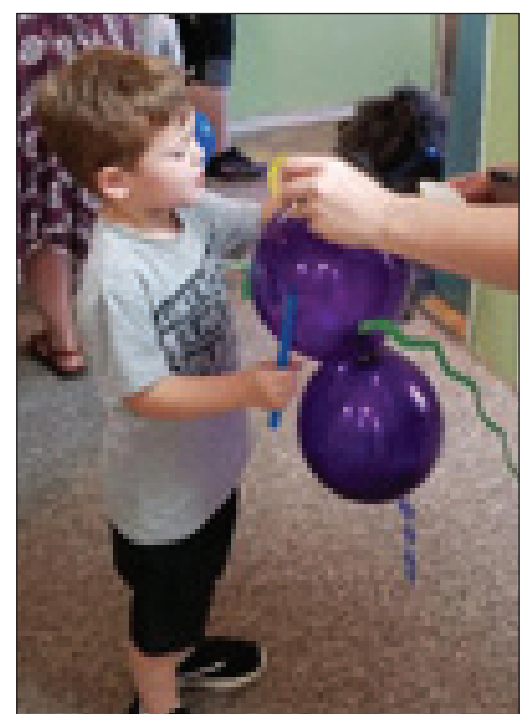

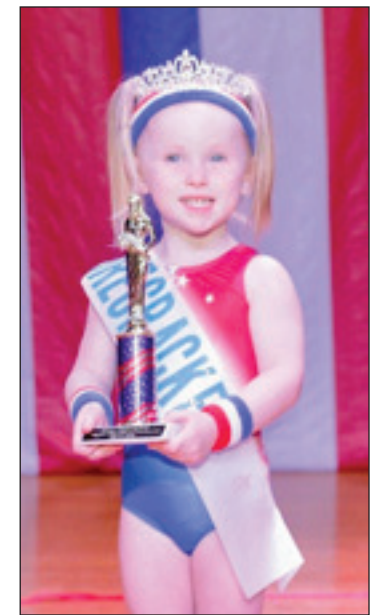
