2020 Budget – Wheeler County, Texas

In accordance with Section 111.0075 of the Texas Local Government Code, the Commissioners Court of Wheeler County, Texas will hold a Public Hearing on Monday, August 26, 2019 at 9:00 AM in the Commissioners Courtroom, Main Floor, Wheeler County Courthouse on the Fiscal Year 2020 proposed budget for Wheeler County.

This budget will raise more total property taxes than last year's budget by \$577,031.83, and of that amount \$31,223.15 is tax revenue to be raised from new property added to the tax roll this year.

Any person may attend and may participate in the hearing regarding the proposed budget.


