Wheeler Mustangs Fall To Hamlin Pied Pipers, 44-15

Fresh off of their lopsided victory over the Lubbock Trinity Lions in the opening week of the season, the Wheeler Mustangs traveled to Childress on Friday night to take on the Hamlin Pied Pipers in an early-season challenge. Hamlin has been quite a strong team in recent years, and this meeting would mark the 3rd time in the past four years that the teams would face off, 2018 being the exception. Both of the prior meetings occurred in the postseason, with Hamlin ending the Mustangs' playoff runs. This year Hamlin was highly lauded by some analysts before the season began, and was known to have several good players, so it was expected this game would be a strong test for the Mustang team.

It was 97° at Charlie Johnston Field for kickoff. Childress is known by some as "the hottest town in the Panhandle" and it lived up to the title Friday night. The Pied Pipers won the coin toss and

elect to receive the opening kickoff, with the Mustangs defending the eastern end zone. The stadium at Childress runs east/west, an unusual layout for a football field, given that it means one team will be looking into the setting sun during early-season evening games. The Mustangs had that disadvantage to reckon with in the first quarter.

Co. Auditor Gets \$1,500 Raise, Briscoe, Allison New Fire Trucks

The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County, Texas, met in regular session on September 9, 2019, at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse at 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern.

The commissioners voted to raise the salary for the Wheeler County Auditor \$1,500 per year; her salary is 81,931.50.

The Wheeler County Home Demonstration's supplement was raised \$2,017.12 to the same as that of the County Agent,

the annual supplement is \$16,801.41.

The County Budget for 2019-2020 was approved by the commissioners.

The 2019-2020 Tax Rate remains the same as it was for 2018-2019, 0.48728.

from some of those situations by some big pass completions from senior QB Gustavo Andrade, one of which coming on a big 4th down conversion. The Mustangs took the ball all the way down the field, burning through most of the first quarter but were ultimately unable to punch it into the end zone, and turned the ball over on downs on the Hamlin 1 yard line. The first quarter ended with the Mustangs trailing, 7-0.

The second quarter began with the Mustang defense forcing Hamlin to punt the ball away, and Wheeler quickly made use of their offensive possession, connecting with a wide-open Balde-mar Gallardo for an 83-yard

Explanatory Statements for the November 5, 2019 Constitutional Amendment Election

Proposition Number 1 (HJR 72)

HJR 72 proposes a constitutional amendment permitting an elected municipal judge to serve as a municipal judge in more than one municipality at the same time. Unlike an appointed municipal judge, an elected municipal judge may not concurrently hold another municipal judge office. This amendment would allow an elected municipal judge to serve as a municipal judge in more than one municipality at the same time, in the same manner as appointed municipal judges.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: **"The constitutional amendment permitting a person to hold more than one office as a municipal judge at the same time."**

Proposition Number 2 (SJR 79)

SJR 79 proposes a constitutional amendment authorizing the Texas Water Development Board to issue additional general obligation bonds, in an amount that does not exceed \$200 million, for the economically distressed areas program. These bonds can only be used to provide financing for the development of water supply and sewer service projects in those economically distressed areas as defined by law.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: **"The constitutional amendment providing for the issuance of additional general obligation bonds by the Texas Water Development Board in an amount not to exceed \$200 million to provide financial assistance for the development of certain projects in economically distressed areas."**

Proposition Number 3 (HJR 34)

HJR 34 proposes a constitutional amendment allowing the legislature to temporarily exempt from ad valorem taxation a portion of certain property located in an area covered by a disaster declaration of the governor. The proposed amendment would allow the legislature to prescribe the method of determining the amount of the tax exemption and the duration of the exemption and also would allow the legislature to create any additional eligibility requirements for the tax exemption.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: **"The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for a temporary exemption from ad valorem taxation of a portion of the appraised value of certain property damaged by a disaster."**

Proposition Number 4 (HJR 38)

HJR 38 proposes a constitutional amendment prohibiting the state

touchdown pass. The extra point was good and the score was then tied 7-7. However, Hamlin quickly struck again, making a couple of big pass connections on their next possession, including a 22-yard touchdown pass to bring the score to 14-7. Wheeler's drive faltered and Hamlin got

the ball back and was driving until Andrade intercepted a Hamlin pass. The Mustangs found themselves playing from behind the line of scrimmage too often on their offensive drive and were unable to move the ball. Hamlin scored twice more in the last five minutes of the half. The

Mustangs had a final opportunity on offense before half-time and advanced to around the Hamlin 35 yard line with just a few seconds remaining. Coach Evans called timeout with 2 seconds remaining on the clock, to allow one go-for-broke attempt at the end zone, but Andrade was brought down as he released the ball and the pass fell incomplete, leaving the halftime score at 28-7.

Halftime always provides a sense of the anticipation and opportunity, and creates suspense as to what kind of adjustments may be made and what spark may be provided in the locker room. The Mustangs emerged from the locker room with clear pep in their step, set to receive the opening kickoff. It was a line-drive kick that Hesston Marshall picked up three yards deep in the Mustang end zone, got past the initial array of Pied Piper cover men, and found an opening near the Mustang sideline, which he paralleled all the way to the end zone for a 103 yard return. However, the return was negated by an illegal block (hold or block in the back) called on the Mustangs, and the ball was brought back to deep within Mustang territory. The Mustang offense stalled and the 'Stangs were forced to punt the ball back to the Pied Pipers, who successfully took the ball down the field and scored to add to their lead and make the score 35-7. The rest of the second half saw some back-and-forth between the teams, with Hamlin adding 9 more points in the form of a field goal followed by a touchdown drive. The Mustangs did put some more points on the board, though, with tailback David Rascon breaking loose on a 40-yard run with a few minutes left in the 4th quarter. The Mustangs ran the ball in for 2 points on the PAT try, bringing the score to Hamlin 44, Wheeler 15, which would

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: **"The constitutional amendment allowing increased distributions to the available school fund."**

Proposition Number 8 (HJR 4)

HJR 4 proposes a constitutional amendment creating the flood infrastructure fund as a special fund in the state treasury, using money appropriated from the economic stabilization fund. The flood infrastructure fund would provide additional resources to implement plans to mitigate flood damage. The proposed amendment would authorize the Texas Water Development Board to use money in the flood infrastructure fund for drainage, flood mitigation, or flood control projects. The proposed amendment also would authorize the creation of separate accounts in the flood infrastructure fund as necessary to administer the fund or authorized projects.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: **"The constitutional amendment providing for the creation of the flood infrastructure fund to assist in the financing of drainage, flood mitigation, and flood control projects."**

Proposition Number 9 (HJR 95)

HJR 95 proposes a constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to create a property tax exemption for precious metal held in a precious metal depository located in this state.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: **"The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to exempt from ad valorem taxation precious metal held in a precious metal depository located in this state."**

Proposition Number 10 (SJR 32)

SJR 32 proposes a constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to allow a state agency or political subdivision to transfer a law enforcement animal to the animal's handler or another qualified caretaker in certain circumstances. Currently, the Texas Constitution prevents the transfer of certain public property, such as law enforcement animals, to a private person or organization at no cost. This amendment authorizes the legislature to allow the transfer of a law enforcement animal to the animal's handler or another qualified caretaker at no cost, upon the animal's retirement or at another time if the transfer is determined to be in the animal's best interest.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: **"The constitutional amendment to allow the transfer of a law enforcement animal to a qualified caretaker in certain circumstances."**



Enrollment Open for Texas Tuition Promise Fund

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar reminds families that open enrollment in the Texas Tuition Promise Fund®, the state's prepaid college tuition program, began Sept. 1 and runs through Feb. 29, 2020. The Texas Tuition Promise Fund offers parents and loved ones the chance to prepay a child's future higher educa-

tion at most Texas public colleges and universities at today's prices.

"September is National College Savings Month, so now is the perfect time to think about a Texas Tuition Promise Fund account, which gives families an additional tool to help plan for their children's future education," Hegar said. "Planning today is a good way to put your child on a path to a college education. The sooner you start saving, the more affordable it could be."

Participants in the plan purchase prepaid "tuition units" that can be used later toward undergraduate resident tuition and schoolwide required fees at most Texas public colleges and universities. Prices are based on 2019-20 academic year costs for the

state's public colleges and universities, excluding medical and dental institutions.

Type I units, priced for undergraduate resident tuition and schoolwide required fees at the most expensive Texas public four-year university or college, cost \$147.80 per unit.

Type II units, based on the weighted average cost of undergraduate resident tuition and schoolwide required fees across all Texas public four-year universities and colleges, cost \$105.54 per unit.

Type III units, priced at the weighted average cost of undergraduate resident tuition

and schoolwide required fees across all Texas public two-year community colleges, cost \$26.84 per unit.

Under the plan, 100 units equal roughly one academic year consisting of 30 semester hours of undergraduate resident tuition and schoolwide required fees at the Texas public school that most closely matches the unit's pricing base. Participants can purchase up to 600 Type I units — approximately six academic years — or the dollar equivalent of Type II or III units.




