

Event To Honor Capt. Alan L. Bean & Apollo Mission Control

On November 14, 1969, Apollo 12 was launched on top of a Saturn V Rocket and began its four day journey to the Moon. Aboard the small Command Module were three Navy Brothers, Charles "Pete" Conrad - Commander, Richard Francis "Dick" Gordon - Command Module Pilot, and Lunar Module Pilot, Alan L. Bean. Seconds after

launch from Pad 39A, Cape Canaveral, now Kennedy Space Center in Florida, it fell to the quick minds and bold decisions of the young men of Mission Control to save the mission and possibly the lives of the men on board the spacecraft. After completing the second manned mission to the Lunar Surface, Apollo 12, returned safely to Earth November 24, 1969.

Special Wheeler County Commissioners' Court Meeting

County Pays \$85,736.02 In Overtime

The Wheeler County Commissioners' Court met in Special Session on Friday, September 27, 2019, at 9:00 A.M. to consider one agenda item. Those present were Judge Hefley, Commissioners David Simpson and John Walker, Margaret Dorman, County Clerk; Renee Warren, County Treasurer, and Nichole Mock, County Auditor. Commissioners Steve Walker and Bob Hink were absent.

Employee Compensatory Time for 2019—Buy Back. David Simpson made a motion which was seconded by John Walker to buy back/ pay all employees that have compensatory time as of September 20, 2019 and due to the fact that the Jail budget does not have sufficient funding to cover their cost, the necessary money will be taken from the County Treasurer budget. Total amounts by department are: Sheriff—\$29,459.52; Jail—\$30,553.77; Pct. #1—\$6,

369.45; Pct. #2—\$7,595.89; Pct. #3—\$8,332.32; Pct. #4—3,425.07. The total was \$85,736.02. Motion carried unanimously.

Employee Compensatory Time is time paid in excess of regular number of hours based on a 40 hour week. This does not apply to deputies. The deputies' compensatory time is hours accrued over 171 hours during a pay period of 28 days. Comp time for all departments is figured at time and a half.

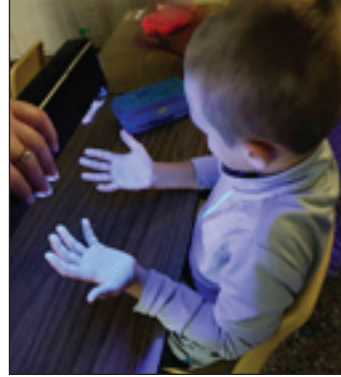
