# MUSTANGS WALLOP SHAMROCK IRISH, 68-2

After traveling nearly 350 miles in Week 7 to go to Monday and back, the Mustangs were glad to be home for their second district game of the season. The Shamrock Irish were coming to town. The matchup with Shamrock is a much-hyped affair with

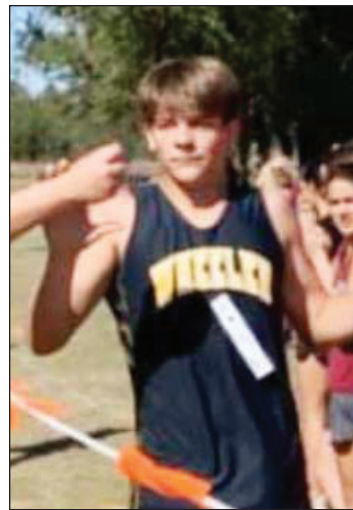
both teams eager to face off against each other in what has been dubbed by some (Gary Ware) as the "North Fork of the Red River Rivalry". This year, however, the game didn't live up to the billing.

A firm south/southeast breeze prevailed at kickoff and would remain throughout the game, eventually bringing some storm clouds with it. The Mustangs would receive the opening kickoff and return it to the Wheeler 38 yard line. The Mustangs have been scoring on the first play of the game lately, and although that wasn't the case on Friday, the first play was still a big pass completion to senior

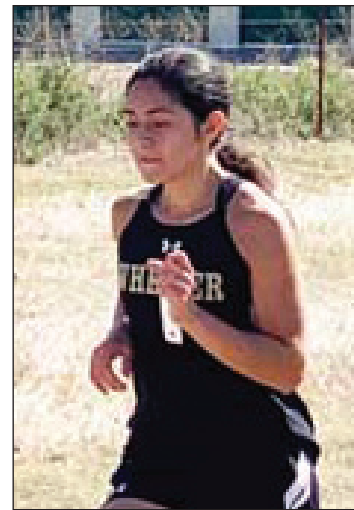
WR Brady Bailey to make a statement early. Next came a 5-yard run, then on the 3rd play of the drive, QB Gustavo Andrade found Bailey again for a 24-yard touchdown pass to put the Mustangs on top barely more than a minute into the game, 6-0. The Mustang defense would kick the ball to Shamrock and, after stuffing the Irish ball carriers on first and second down, Senior DB Baldemar Gallardo intercepted an Irish pass on 3rd down and ran it 28 yards into the end zone for a Mustang defensive touchdown, leaving the score 12-0. The Irish went three-and-out on their next drive after finding themselves in a big hole as a result of a sack by Hess-

ton Marshall on 2nd down. The Mustangs would field the Shamrock punt at the Wheeler 17 yard line and run the ball down the field, with Marshall breaking loose on a 49-yard touchdown run to put more points on the scoreboard. The two-point try saw lineman #52 Daniel Rascon line up in the backfield and receive the handoff, carrying it into the end zone to bring the score to 20-0 with 5:30 to play in the first quarter. Again the Irish went three-and-out and the Mustangs received the ball near midfield and again connected on a big pass play, this time a 49-yarder to Brady Bailey for another touchdown, bringing the

## Apollo 12 Fiftieth Anniversary Approaching

# Event To Honor Capt. Alan L. Bean & Apollo Mission Control

## Dinner Tickets and Medals Limited

On November 14, 1969, Apollo 12 was launched on top of a Saturn V Rocket and began its four day journey to the Moon. Aboard the small Command Module were three Navy Brothers, Charles "Pete" Conrad - Commander,

Richard Francis "Dick" Gordon - Command Module Pilot, and Lunar Module Pilot, Alan L. Bean. Seconds after launch from Pad 39A, Cape Canaveral, now Kennedy Space Center in Florida, it fell to the quick minds and bold

decisions of the young men of Mission Control to save the mission and possibly the lives of the men on board the spacecraft. After completing the second manned mission to the Lunar Surface, Apollo 12, returned safely to Earth November 24, 1969.

On Saturday, November

16, 2019 The Wheeler Historical Museum will host an all day celebration to honor Wheeler's Native Son, CAPT Alan L. Bean and the Heroes of Mission Control who made the APOLLO program successful. A stellar group will join the activities beginning with the 5K / FUNRUN launch

score to 26-0. Things went awry for the Mustangs on the 2-point try- the Irish were able to intercept the Mustang pass and run it all the way back to the Mustang end zone to score two points, leaving the score 26-2. Although unable to prevent the ball carrier from reaching the end zone, excellent effort was shown by some of the Mustangs in pursuing the ball carrier the entire length of the field, most notably by #40 Luis Jaquez.

The Irish fumbled on their next possession and the Mustangs regained possession of the football and quickly got into the end zone on a long run, only to have it negated by a block in the back penalty. It didn't stop the Mustangs though, with Baldemar Gallardo receiving a 13-yard touchdown pass. On the 2-point try, another lineman, #55 Marcos Herrera carried the ball in for two points to bring the score to 34-2 at the end of the 1st quarter.

The Irish had the ball as the 2nd quarter began, but play was quickly halted by the officials because of the presence of lightning in the proximity. The teams left the field and many of the fans left the elevated bleachers to congregate at ground level during the delay. A couple of times during the delay it appeared the game was about to resume, only to have the teams forced back into their locker rooms because of another proximal lightning strike. Eventually, after about an hour, the players did get a chance to resume the game. Coming back to the field after such a disruption in the regular flow of the game can sometimes also disrupt the performance or dynamics of the game, but in this case the teams picked up where they left off, with the Mustangs forcing a punt and then moving the ball down the field for another touchdown, again carried by Marshall, and increasing the score to 42-2.

The next Irish possession saw the Irish pick up a first down and then quickly have their drive terminated when Marshall intercepted an option pitch in the Irish backfield and carried the ball in for another touchdown. It was a great defensive play, with the option pitch man being hit by another Mustang defender as the ball was to arrive, and Marshall coming down with the ball and leaving the score 48-2 midway through the second quarter. Shamrock fumbled on their next possession and the Mustangs took over at the Irish 44 and again asserted their will, moving the ball down to the 1-yard line, and from there Daniel Rascon carried it in for a touchdown, with the two-point try bringing the score to 56-2, which would be the score at the end of the 2nd quarter.

There was no halftime in this ballgame, presumably with the coaches agreeing to go ahead and start the 3rd quarter without a break, as a result of the lengthy lightning delay and the lopsided score. Shamrock began the 3rd quarter on offense, only to have Baldemar Gallardo intercept a pass to give the ball back to the Mustangs, who moved the ball down the field and into the end zone, with the score coming on an 18-yard touchdown pass to senior WR Jayton Couch. The 2-point try was no good and the score was 62-2. The next two possessions saw Shamrock turn the ball over on downs, followed by the Mustangs turning it over on downs back to Shamrock.
