**'Stangs** (from Page 1) Mustangs pooched a kickoff against the Shamrock Irish in week 2 of district play and received some veiled criticism about kicking an 'onside' kick with a dominant lead, but there are a couple of significant differences between an onside kick and a pooch kick: 1) For an onside kick the

ball travels essentially on or near the ground, making contact with the ground almost immediately after leaving the kicker's foot. One of the effects of this is to deliver a kickoff that is difficult for the receiving team to field due to the oblong shape of the football and the random and absolutely unpredictable way the ball will bounce as it encounters the ground numerous times during the onside kick. A pooch kick, however, travels through the air, over the heads of the first line of kickoff return men.
