



Wheeler's first winter storm began around 12:15 p.m. Thursday, October 24, 2019, as frozen rain. Two to three inches of snow was measured Friday morning.

MUSTANGS SAIL PAST CYCLONES

The Wheeler Mustangs traveled to Memphis last Friday night to face the Memphis Cyclones in district play and carry on the Mustangs' undefeated district campaign. It was a chilly evening for football, with the wind still blowing from the north, the final remnant of the strong cold front that had brought snow and sleet to the area the day before. The Cyclones won the coin toss and would receive the opening kickoff and begin their first possession at their own 36 yard line. The Mustang defense quickly forced Memphis into a 4th down & 4 and stuffed the

Cyclones on 4th down, giving the ball to the Mustangs with excellent field position. The Mustangs continued their habit of scoring quickly, with Hesston Marshall breaking free on the second play of the drive for a 35-yard touchdown run, the first of several of the night for Marshall. The point after try failed and the Mustangs led 6-0.

The next possession saw another three-and-out for Memphis, followed by another quick score by the Mustangs, a 70-yard touchdown run by Marshall on the first play of the Mustangs' drive (can it really be called a drive if it only takes one play?) With 5:08 remaining in the first quarter the Mustangs led 12-0. Again Memphis was forced into a 3rd & long, and senior DB Baldemar Gallardo excellently broke up a long 3rd down pass by Memphis to force a 4th down punt. Upon regaining possession, the Mustangs scored on their first play again, this time a 54-yard touchdown pass from Gustavo Andrade to Marshall, who was wearing a rut into the end zone by this point of the game. The Mustangs tried a different approach on their two point conversion play and gave the ball to one of their linemen, #58 Paden Markham, who spun out of a would-be tackle and carried the ball across the goal line for two points. The score at the end of the first quarter was Wheeler 20, Memphis 0.

Memphis began the second quarter on offense and picked up three first downs on penalties- twice on fourth down hard counts on which the Mustangs were flagged for being offsides, and once on a defensive holding call, advancing the ball to the Mustang side of the field, but when Memphis fumbled the ball, Markham was quick to recover it and put an end to

the Memphis drive. What followed was another one-play score, a 58-yard run by Marshall to bring the score to 26-0. The Mustangs attempted a pooch kick on the ensuing

kickoff and it landed in no-man's-land, and Mustang senior Ian Finsterwald was quick

to recover the ball for the Mustangs. It seems worthy at this

point to differentiate a pooch kick from an onside kick- the

Event To Honor Capt. Alan L. Bean & Apollo Mission Control

On November 14, 1969, Apollo 12 was launched on top of a Saturn V Rocket and began its four day journey to the Moon. Aboard the small Command Module were three "Navy Brothers", Charles

"Pete" Conrad - Commander, Richard Francis "Dick" Gordon - Command Module Pilot, and Lunar Module Pilot, Alan L. Bean. Seconds after launch from Pad 39A, Cape Canaveral, now Kennedy Space Center in Florida, it fell

to the quick minds and bold decisions of the young men of Mission Control to save the mission. John Aaron, born near Wellington, Texas, sent the initial instructions to the Apollo crew. On board, only Alan Bean, born in Wheeler, Texas, knew what to do. After completing the second

manned mission to the Lunar Surface, Apollo 12, returned safely to Earth November 24, 1969.

On Saturday, November 16, 2019 The Wheeler Historical Museum will host an all day celebration to honor Wheeler's Native Son, CAPT Alan L. Bean and the Heroes of Mis-

sion Control who made the APOLLO program successful. A stellar group will join the activities beginning with the

The Mustangs received the ball to begin the second half and continued scor-

ing, with sophomore QB Nathan Rowley carrying the ball across the goal line on a 25-yard touchdown run to cap the five-play drive and bring the score to 38-0. Another Memphis three-and-out led to a punt by Memphis, on which Mustang punt returner Gustavo Andrade fielded the ball at the Mustang 45 yard line and found an opening near the Memphis sideline. There was a defender between Andrade and the end zone, but an excellent block by Diego Pichardo granted Andrade a clear path in for the score to increase the lead to 44-0. Memphis would have the ball one more time in the 3rd quarter and would punt as the quarter ended.

Upon receiving the punt, the Mustangs added a final score, a 50-yard run by David Rascon to leave the score 50-0. The Mustangs would not score again, but the remainder of the fourth quarter saw many of the young Mustang players get in to the game. After the victory in Memphis, the Mustangs are 7-1 on the season and continue their winning streak, increasing it to 6 consecutive wins. On Friday night the Mustangs will travel to Quanah to face the Quanah Indians as district play continues.

Mustangs pooched a kickoff against the Shamrock Irish in week 2 of district play and received some veiled criticism about kicking an 'onside' kick with a dominant lead, but there are a couple of significant differences between an onside kick and a pooch kick:

1) For an onside kick the ball travels essentially on or near the ground, making contact with the ground almost immediately after leaving the kicker's foot. One of the effects of this is to deliver a kickoff that is difficult for the receiving team to field due to the oblong shape of the football and the random and absolutely unpredictable way the ball will bounce as it encounters the ground numerous times during the onside kick. A pooch kick, however, travels through the air, over the heads of the first line of kickoff return men.

2) There is no way to defend against an onside kick except for a return man to field the ball before being taken out by the kickoff cover team, who are running down the field intending to engage the members of the kickoff return team before the return team can field the ball. On a pooch kick, though, the return team can call for a 'fair catch' by raising their arm, which prevents by rule the kickoff

cover team from contacting or otherwise interfering with the return team's fielding of the kickoff. Fair catch is not pos-

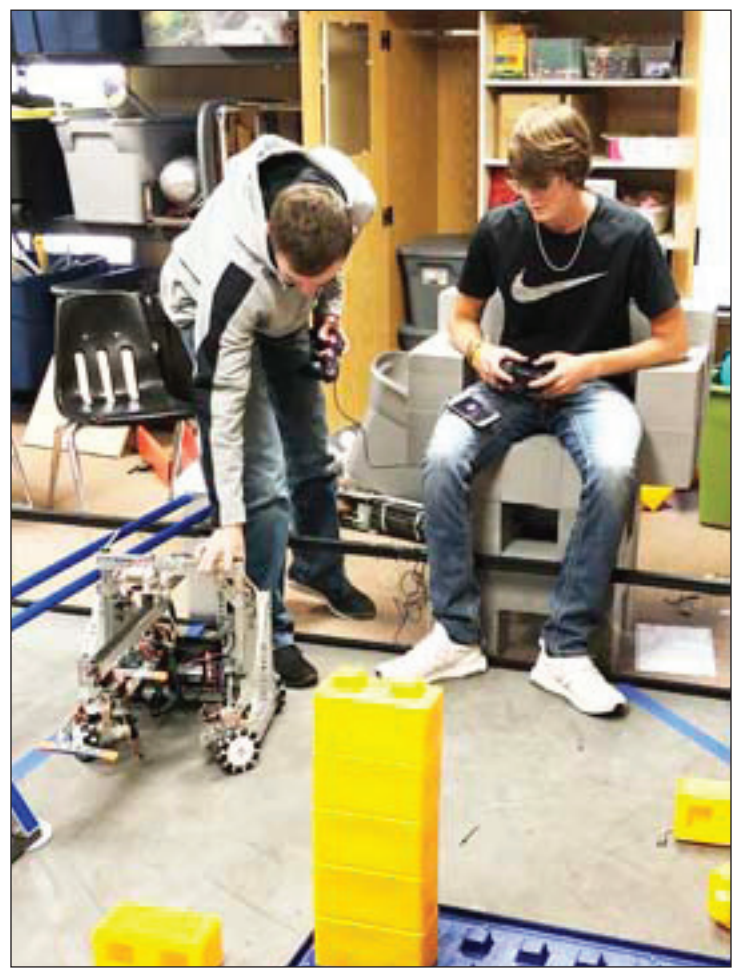

Meet The Kelton Robotic Teams

Minds are working and gears are turning here at Kelton ISD. Students at Kelton are provided an opportunity to construct a robot that has to accomplish a specific task and compete with other teams from all around the world to see who has the best ideas and thoughts to construct a robot and how well each team materialize their thoughts. The contest these children participate in is called the First Tech Challenge. Every year First creates a specific task that has to be accomplished in form of a game. Basically, this year us students have been challenged to build a robot that can gather blocks and be able to stack them. There is also an autonomous period where teams can acquire points as well. The constraints are that our robot has to be under 42 pounds and less than 18 inches in width, length, and

height. The dimensions of the blocks are 2 inches by 2 inches by 8 inches. Kelton has three FTC teams all whom which are different ages. Even though one team may consist of younger members they will still compete against the same people.

The team whom has the most experience here at Kelton ISD is team 9778 Robotic Chinchillas. They have participated in FTC for about 5 years and have been to world three times, won UIL Robotics State Champions in 2018 and 2017, and acquired second place the UIL Robotics State Competitions last year. The members of the team are Brock Buckingham, Mark Herndon, Trace Carey, and Kaleb Kimbro. Marlen Alvarado and Alexis Lopez are doing their engineering notebook for the first time this year. So far this year, they have constructed their robot

and now have it programmed. At the moment, they are now just flattening out some bugs like cable management and the lift system. There robot has claw linked to a central lift assembly that moves vertically to stack a block.

The second team is team 14806 Gemini and this now there second year in robotics. Last year as a rookie team they acquired the Think Award for having an amazing engineering journey and the Rockwell Collins award for showing signs promising innovation skills paired math and science incorporated in robotics. Very few teams can accomplish this much their first year. The team is comprised Pavan Patel whom is the builder, programmer, and driver. He is also a reporter that writes articles like this for multiple media sources in order to spread the word of FTC. Another member of the team is Nicholas Benson whom is the builder and driver. Isabella Samaniego is the graphics designer as well as Zen Lister. Finally, Marlen Alvarado and Alexis Lopez create the engineering notebook. Work has steadily progressed on their robot as well. They have a two-part system where at one end of the robot a block is intake and the block is then channel to the arm mechanism for stack-

ing. They have the robot built and programmed and are now flattening out minor bugs like programming errors and cable management.

The third team whom has the least experience in FTC is team 16799 Robotic Wookies.

This is their rookie year but they have shown to be an innovative and cooperative young team and have proven to be very resourceful. This team comprises of Raj Bhahta, Shivan Patel, Trenton Neville, and Skye Slatery. Since it is their rookie year, all the teams with more experience have all been doing their best to make sure the team knows what they're doing and to answer any questions they might have. They have received programming help from Mark Herndon and Pavan Patel. They have also got building tips of Brock Buckingham and Pavan Patel. They have restarted their building process because they decided that being able to stack block is critical to be successful in matches. They have the lift assembly build but are still assembling the claw. Mark Herndon is work with the Wookies on their program.

Kelton ISD is hoping to have a better and more successful robotics program even before even more than

the year before. The children have learned valuable life skills like trouble shooting and cooperation. They have also learned the principles of gracious professionalism and have implemented them into their daily lives. We hope that you will come attend our next competition in Stinnett, Texas. Jim Hall has become well-known for his peanut and pecan-brittle contributions, which is a family tradition started by his dad, Lester Hall. He has the recipe memorized, as well as all the tricks for making it turn out perfectly: the acid smell of raw peanuts changing to roasted

smell, the candy-string that springs into the air...

As people arrive, the usual circle-the-wagon parking is modified to block-the-wind parking, all along the north side. Nobody told them...they think about the little trick-or-treaters, and apply common sense.

Every year someone adds a good idea...like melted caramel in a crockpot for apple dipping. Little kids and adults alike show up in wonderful costumes...everything from Sasquatch to wind-up dolls to Lady Liberty to Grapes-from-the-Promised-Land.

At least two people are observed carrying dogs around...whether to keep the dog warm, or the owner warm, the observer may decide. And a great-aunt is spotted in a car, holding a sleeping infant, snug and warm, while mom and siblings participate in the fun activities.

As the evening's activities draw to a close, a high school boy springs up to help the rancher re-load his hay, but no quicker than two or three other men. It is quickly done. Was much money raised, you may wonder? No. This is community...everyone donates their candy, desserts, food, crafts, wood, time...

No wonder we want to keep small towns alive.
