MUSTANGS RUN PAST EAGLES

After holding off the Archer City Wildcats in the first round of the playoffs, the Mustangs traveled to Levelland to face the Eldorado Eagles in the Area round. The Mustangs

were 9-2 after beating the Wildcats, and the District 8 champion Eagles came in to the game with a 10-1 record. The weather was temperate for late November, with temperatures in the 40s at kickoff.

The Mustangs would receive the opening kickoff and look to continue to assert their will on offense, as they had done in the Archer City game, but a fumble on the first drive gave the ball to the

Eagles, who began moving the ball against the Mustangs for a few plays, but on the second set of downs, with the Eagles facing a 3rd & 1, the Mustang defense stiffened up and forced the Eagles into a

turnover on downs, delivering the ball back to the Mustangs. Unfortunately the Mustangs were unable to cap a drive and faced a 4th down of their own but failed to convert and turned the ball over to the

Eagles on downs, but not for long, as the Mustangs forced an Eagle fumble on that possession and made the recovery, giving the Mustangs possession again. This time

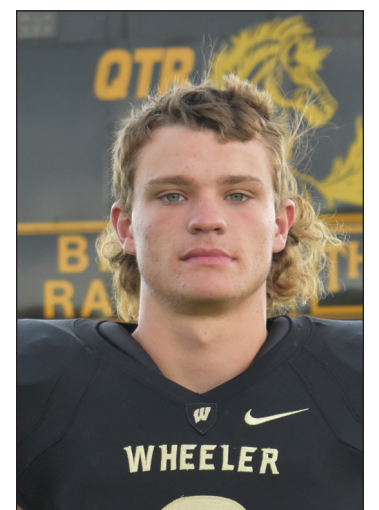

The Mustangs moved the ball down the field and into the end zone for the first score of the game to give the Mustangs the lead, 6-0. On the following Eagle possession, senior DB Baldemar Gallardo intercepted an Eagle pass and returned the ball about 60 yards, almost scoring on the play, before being brought down at the 5-yard line, leaving the Mustangs with a first & goal. Senior QB Gustavo Andrade carried the ball in from there, and following the two-point conversion Wheeler led 14-0 at the end of the 1st quarter.

Eldorado would not hang their heads for long, though. A short kick gave the Eagles excellent field position and they utilized some big plays to move the ball downfield and into the end zone to bring the score to 14-7 in the early moments of the 2nd quarter. It was as close as Eldorado would get to the Mustangs though-the Mustang offense clicked on their next drive and scored on a 40-yard touchdown carry by Hesston Marshall, and Gustavo Olivas' PAT kick was good, to make the score 21-7. Then on the ensuing kickoff, a Mustang kickoff cover man was able to catch the ball out of the air, giving the Mustangs possession on the Eldorado side of the field, and the Mustang offense took only four plays to advance to the end zone, with Andrade scoring on a 1-yard TD run, which with the 2-point conversion bumped the score to 29-7. On Eldorado's next possession the Mustang defense forced the Eagles into a 4th & long and the Eagles punted the ball back to the Mustangs. The Mustangs got in a jam with back-to-back penalties and had to punt back to Eldorado. Again the Mustang defense delivered when on the Eagles' drive Nathan Rowley hit an intended receiver just as the ball was arriving, jarring the ball loose, and Andrade was able to pluck it out of the air for the interception to give the Mustangs excellent field position at the Eagles' 24 yard line. A few plays later, Hesston Marshall carried the ball into the end zone for a Mustang touchdown, and the score was 35-7 a couple of minutes before halftime. The Eagles could not mount a drive against the Mustang defense on the final possession of the half but they did extinguish the clock, and the teams went to halftime with the Mustangs on top 35-7.

The Mustangs kicked the ball to the Eagles to begin the 2nd half and the Mustang defense continued their excellent play, with Zach Butler intercepting an Eagle pass. The Mustang offense was hampered by penalties and was unable to get going on their possession though, and punted the ball back to the Eagles. But again Mustang special teams play made an impact when senior WR Brady Bailey put himself in position to down Andrade's punt at the Eagles' 1-yard line, an excellent play. This set up a defensive score when senior LB Ian Finsterwald broke through the Eagles' line to tackle the ball carrier in the end zone for a safety, making the score 37-7. Finsterwald also fielded the Eagles' punt that followed the safety and returned it 35 yards to give the Mustangs excellent field position at the Eagle 32. Andrade took it from there, scoring on the first play, which with Olivas' PAT made the score 44-7 and the game was blown wide open. The Mustang defense again delivered a turnover when Finsterwald forced a fumble on the next Eagle possession, leaving the Mustangs

with another short field, from which they scored another Mustang touchdown & PAT to pad their lead, 51-7. The Mustangs were able to recover the ensuing kickoff and give the offense possession again, which led to another Mustang score, this one carried by David Rascon, and with another Olivas-kicked PAT brought the score to 58-7 at the end of the 3rd quarter.

The Eagles had the ball as the 4th quarter began and were able to mount a long drive and score to a touchdown, making the score 58-13. The Mustangs were unable to move the ball on their next possession and punted back to the Eagles, and again the Mustang defense forced a turnover when Brett Brittain intercepted an Eagle pass to give the Mustangs a short field yet again. The Mustangs made use of the short field with Rascon taking the touchdown pitch on an option play. Olivas' PAT try was good, his 5th of the game, to make the score 65-13. Another Eagle possession followed and resulted in another turnover, when Nathan Rowley intercepted the ball and returned it approximately 50 yards. This time, though, the Mustangs would not score, and the teams traded possessions to leave the final score 65-13.

The Mustang defense had an excellent night against the Eagles. They forced several turnovers, and perhaps as importantly, stopped the Eagles early in the game after a Mustang fumble and a turnover on downs, when the Eagles had chances to capitalize on momentum opportunities. The Mustangs'

PAT team also had their best game of the season, without question. Olivas made all 5 of the PAT tries. These kicks can be difference makers in close games and the Mustangs' making all of the PATs is an excellent sign. Although it took a few possessions for them to get started, once the Mustang offense got going they continued to roll, piling up many points. And the Mustang underclassmen got an opportunity to get in the game, gaining some valuable playoff experience, which simply has a different feel than a regular-season game. With the victory, the Mustangs advance to the Regional round of the playoffs, where they will face a familiar foe: the Hamlin Pied Pipers. The Mustangs played the Pied Pipers in week 2 of the season, and played poorly and were beaten. But almost 3 months have passed since then and the Mustangs have an opportunity to rectify the early-season loss. The regional game is set to occur Friday, November 29, at Charlie Johnston field in Childress at 6pm.

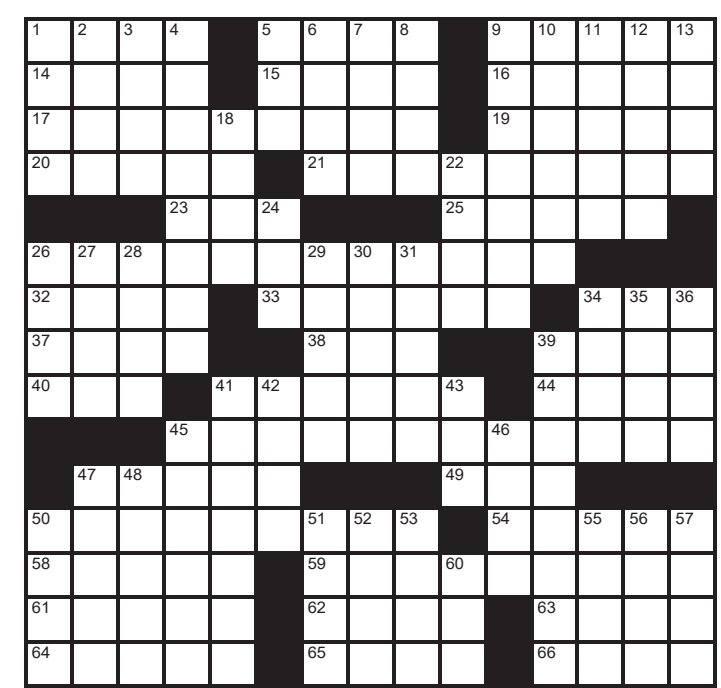

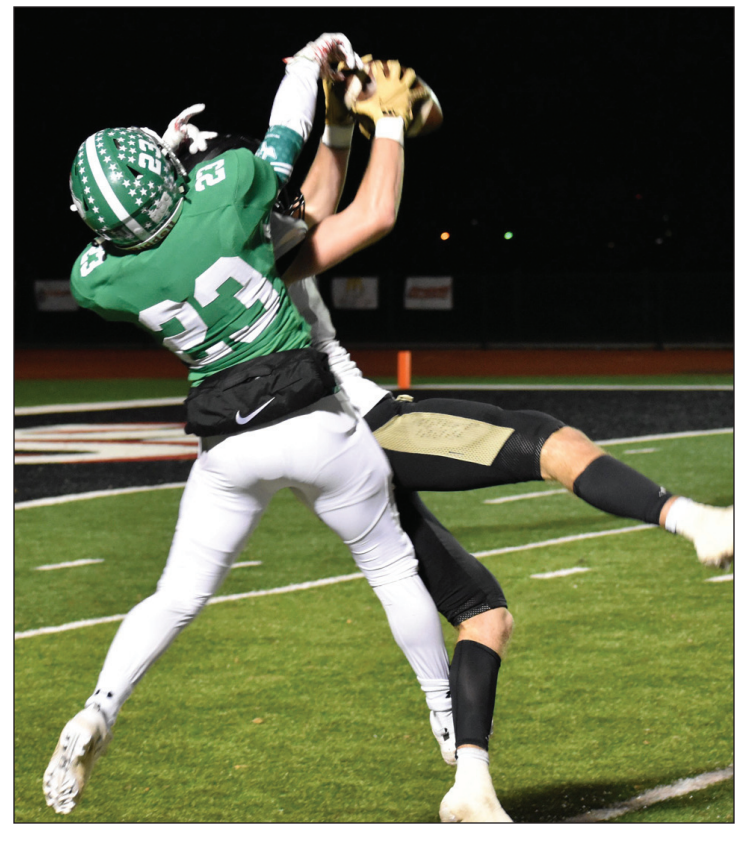

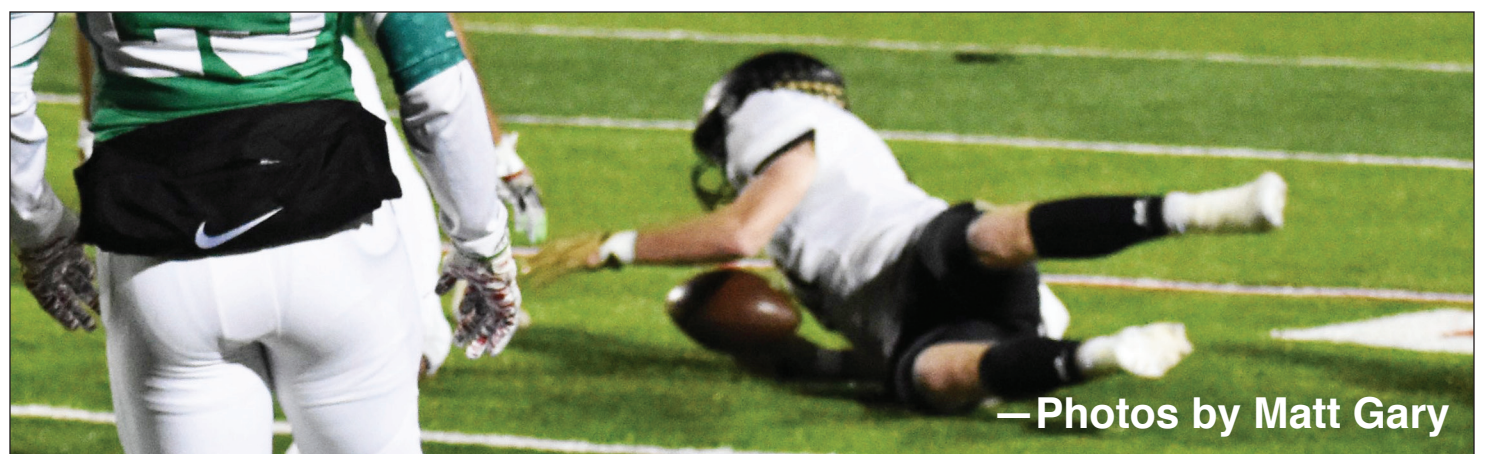
