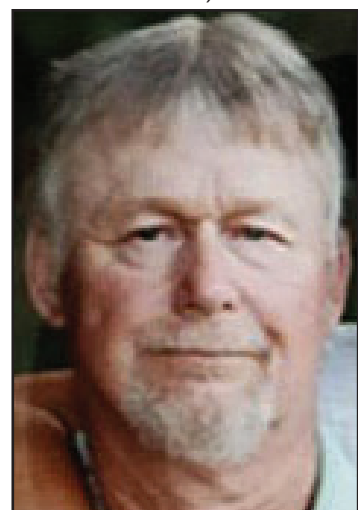

He ran a local grocery, farmed and worked in the cotton gins and fields of Cochran County. He then moved to Dallas and was a store manager for Kroger. There he met and married Toni Willoughby in 1972. They moved to Wheeler to join the family farming and ginning at M&M Gin and farms. He was a founding member of St. Mary's Catholic Church in Wheeler, where he served as the Head of Finance until December of 2019. las, Texas, Tommy was the son of Tommy Powell Calverley, Sr. and Bessie Duff (Yarborough) Calverley. Moving to Wheeler, Texas, at an early age, it was there that Tommy attended school and participated in athletics. Some of the highlights of Tommy's life occurred when he was in school with his teammates, or

"My Guy's" as Tommy would call them, as they went to state in 1977, 1978 and 1979 — winning the state football championship in both 1977 and 1979. In those days, Tommy was known for his speed and it was said that he could run like the wind. Moving to Sweetwater his senior year, Tommy graduated high school in 1980.

On July 10, 1981, Tommy married the love of his life,

Glenda Kay Hagerman. The couple would spend the next 38 wonderful years together until Tommy's untimely death. Shortly after their marriage, they moved to Lakin, Kansas where they spent a short time before moving back to Sweetwater. In 1998, they made their home in Sayre.

Known as a hardworking man, Tommy worked in the oil field for several years and was later employed by CCA, at the Sayre Prison, in the maintenance department where he later served as a supervisor. Tommy's last employment was with Superior Fabrication retiring in March 2019 when he and Glenda moved to Ardmore.

In his spare time, Tommy enjoyed hunting, riding motorcycles and watching his grandchildren at their sporting events. Tommy was a volunteer fireman at the Sweetwater and Sayre Fire Departments, President of OK #8 Red Knights Motorcycle Club and member of the First Baptist Church in Sayre.

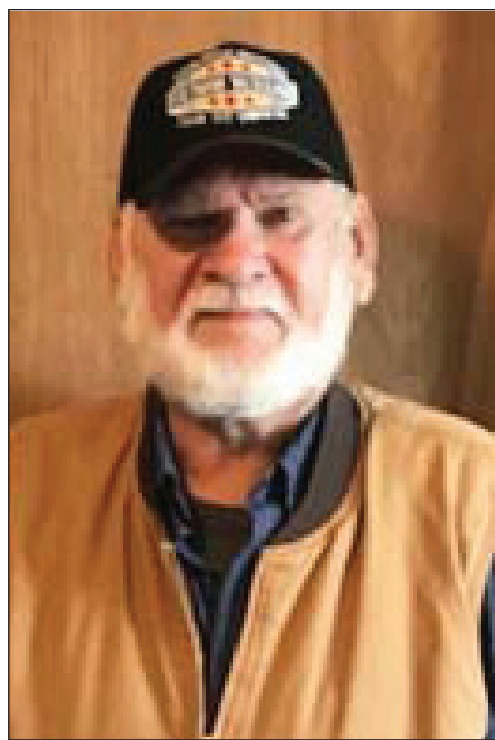

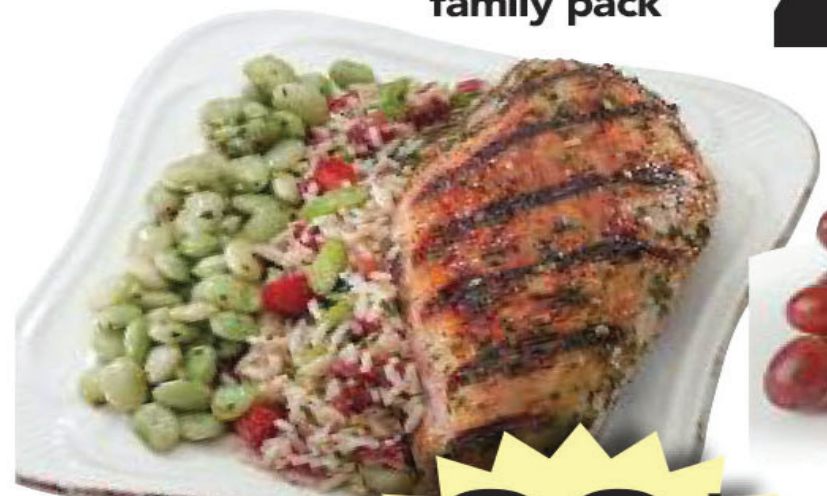
