by the great John Wooden in the Times a couple weeks back that said "If you don't have the time to do it right, when will you have the time to do it over?" In my view that sort of describes the pandemic response in general. It seems to me there have been numerous restrictions implemented, both on the state and national level, in an effort to contain the virus, but they have generally been done incrementally, and slowly, leading to more drastic measures when the virus spread at an unacceptable rate. And by the time the more drastic measures were implemented, the public had grown tired and worn out psychologically by the lockdown measures. Now, after having had many restrictions lifted, we find ourselves playing the game of catch up, but this time with a weary public. I am not in favor of a heavy-handed government - after all, the individuals who comprise the government have their own agendas that are often not in congruence with mine - but I do not believe the mask-wearing order is not a significant encroachment on my liberty. There have been questions about the efficacy of wearing a mask as a means of **that** preventing the spread of CO-VID-19, but the odds seem to be in favor of its efficacy. How could a barrier be more harmful, across the board, than helpful? From what I understand the mask is not as much a defense mechanism for the wearer (though intuitively it seems that it must provide some defense for the wearer from exposure to a germ or virus), as it is for the people whom the wearer may encounter - that is, the primary purpose of the mask is to diminish the chance of the mask-wearer spreading the disease (mostly unknowingly, since asymptomatic spread seems to be such a problem with this virus) to other individuals. If that is so, and if it is effective in this regard, it is reasonable to require the mask be worn. We already limit individuals' behavior for the good of the public. The possible examples of these limitations are myriad, but a few of quick ones to mention are speed limits, and prohibitions against smoking indoors, along with the general requirement to be clothed when in public. The order to wear a mask could be seen to fall in line along the same cat-

The same Notice of Virtual goes for makeup, which is clearly a form of mask - all one needs to do for proof of this is to examine the word mascara, which has some rather obvious similarities to the word "mask", and possibly derives from some word meaning mask in another language. In summary, the Governor has declared most Texans (along with people who merely happen to be in Texas) must wear a mask.
