Merely Mustard

I find myself in the all-to-familiar position of needing a column and lacking a plan for such. Therefore, I shall resort to writing about a topic which I can't imagine is of much interest: the mechanics of how these columns come together. A friend of mine is a writer (and a much better storyteller than I), and he recently sent me four columns he had written, soliciting my input about them. They were wonderfully well done and I made no content suggestions, only one punctuation suggestion. But I was impressed with the fact that he had four columns in the bag, ready to go whenever he needed them, according to the time frame within which he publishes them. I have

thought that it would be nice to have a number of columns in reserve, so that each time a new one is required I wasn't grasping at straws for a topic. Yet, despite my preference for and the obvious benefits of having a week or two's worth of writings completed, I have never established that buffer. Therefore, I go back to the well each week and see if there is anything there. It could be said that I operate more on the Manna time frame, relying on the blessing of being able to come up with something when it is needed.

The Manna reference was made as an attempt at humor; nonetheless it got me thinking there are some actual parallels between my writing this

piece and the failure to plan for it, and the spiritual life. Foremost, I am absolutely dependent on receiving my daily bread, or, in this case, my weekly bread. But how it is received differs. Sometimes it seems to fall into my lap with little effort of my own, and perhaps even less explanation. These are the unexpected times when blessings appear undeservedly and simply overwhelm the recipient into a state of stunned gratitude. I am perhaps exaggerating the level of excitement and appreciation I have for a finished piece, but I mean to allude to the times when an individual is overwhelmed by the experience of unearned favor, i.e. grace.

Other times, there is a need to write, to stay on schedule and meet the deadline, but nothing about which to say, it seems. In these instances I have found that what is necessary is to simply put in the work and hope that it comes together. So far, when I have, it has come together, to a greater or lesser degree (or, to borrow a phrase from the marriage rite, for all the romantics, "for richer or for poorer"). I suppose it can be likened to Abraham and his party setting out, without knowing where they were going, and eventually arriving where they were destined to be. Or perhaps it is like walking a path in the dark of night, when you can only see one step in front of you, and you continually discover the path and negotiate the terrain as you proceed. What I mean to

say is that, in juxtaposition to the scenarios described in the previous paragraph, there are times when you simply have to set out, in hope and in faith that you will arrive at the destination (even if you do not know what the destination is), and I have found that principle can apply in the spiritual life as well. Even if it could not, there is tremendous value in the practice of beginning the work when there is work to do, even if you are unsure as to how it will be completed. Put another way by the artist Pablo Picasso, "Inspiration exists, but it has to find us working." You may not know how you will be able to finish, but you know for certain that you will not finish if you fail to begin. So, this piece comes together as though a surfer were riding the wave of inspiration and the mundane, with

the surfboard representing the simple idea of work, the vehicle that carries the surfer to the reward.

Another spiritual application I could speak about is the need to remain docile to subtle inspirations and promptings, like a horse who perceives and reacts to the subtlest motions of its rider, be it a slight tightening of the rider's legs against the horse's side, or the most delicate touch of the rein to the neck. Similarly, as the horse doesn't know exactly where the rider is directing it, and finds out as it walks along and is corrected or redirected as needed, I often don't know the direction this piece is leading, or being led. I recognize that sometimes that is painfully apparent, but such is the structure, or lack of structure,

ture, within which it happens. Finally, I would like to beg your pardon for my writing about how I write (as if merely reading what I write were not an exercise enough). I recognize it is vanity to the max to think that the mechanics of how these pieces come together are of any interest (they are certainly not of any import), and I remain reticent to even publish this; yet the paradox is that writing about such a topic is also an act of abasement, as it is more than a bit embarrassing to even begin to suggest, or allow, by writing such a piece as this, the suggestion to be erroneously made, that I believe it is of any interest as to how they come together. If writing this were an act of pride, its irrelevance and lack of excellence would also serve as an act of humiliation, like the athlete with the avant-garde hair cut meant to draw attention to himself, who misses the free throws that could have won the game. Nevertheless, such thoughts came to mind as I approached the task of writing today, and like the horse who walks without knowing definitely the way, so I began and now, gratefully, have arrived at the end.

July State Sales Tax Near \$3 Billion

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar today said state sales tax revenue totaled \$2.98 billion in July, 4.3 percent more than in July 2019.

The majority of July sales tax revenue is based on sales made in June and remitted to the agency in July. Widespread social distancing requirements were more relaxed across the state in June than in previous months.

"State sales tax collections in July were better than expected, increasing despite the high unemployment due to the pandemic," Hegar said. "The increase was due to a surge in collections from the retail trade sector; receipts from other major sectors — including mining, construction, wholesale trade, services and restaurants — showed significant declines.

"Collections from e-commerce were up sharply, as many consumers chose to shop online rather than at brick-and-mortar stores. Also, more online marketplace and remote vendors are required to collect and remit Texas tax following the Wayfair decision and subsequent legislation passed last session. Increased time spent at home both for teleworking and staycations, in lieu of leisure travel, spurred sharply higher spending for home improvements.

"Collections from food and beverage stores also were up strongly, as consumers replaced purchases of alcohol from restaurants and bars with alcohol purchased for off-premise consumption (alcohol sales at bars and restaurants are subject to mixed beverage taxes, not sales and use tax)," Hegar said. "Collections from sporting goods stores also rose significantly, as consumers turned to home workouts, bicycling, boating, camping and other forms of outdoor recreation consistent with social distancing.

"With about 1.3 million Texans with continued claims for insured unemployment and another 184,000 receiving benefits under the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance program in June, it's likely that consumer spending was significantly supported by enhanced benefits provided by the federal CARES Act and related legislation enacted in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. With the expiration of these benefits at the end of July, consumer spending and sales tax collections may decline in coming months."

Total sales tax revenue for the three months ending in July 2020 was down 5.3 percent compared to the same period a year ago. Sales tax is the largest source of state funding for the state budget, accounting for 57 percent of all tax collections. The effects of the economic slowdown and low oil prices were more evident in other sources of revenue in July 2020, though most were improved compared to previous months.

Texas collected the follow-

ing revenue from other major taxes: motor vehicle sales and rental taxes — \$466 million, down 3.7 percent from July 2019; motor fuel taxes — \$304 million, down 2.2 percent from July 2019; oil production tax — \$187 million, down 40 percent from July 2019; natural gas production tax — \$37 million, down 71 percent from July 2019; hotel occupancy tax — \$34 million, down 42 percent from July 2019; and alcoholic beverage taxes — \$110 million, down 6.2 percent from July 2019. These collections were inflated by a delay in liquor tax remittances, resulting in the July receipt of four months' worth of remittances in liquor taxes due to the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission. Mixed beverage gross re-

ceipts and sales taxes, which typically make up the bulk of monthly alcoholic beverage tax collections, were down 41 percent compared to July 2019.

Fiscal 2020 franchise tax collections, which were deferred to July, totaled \$4.17 billion, 4.8 percent more than in fiscal 2019 year-to-date.

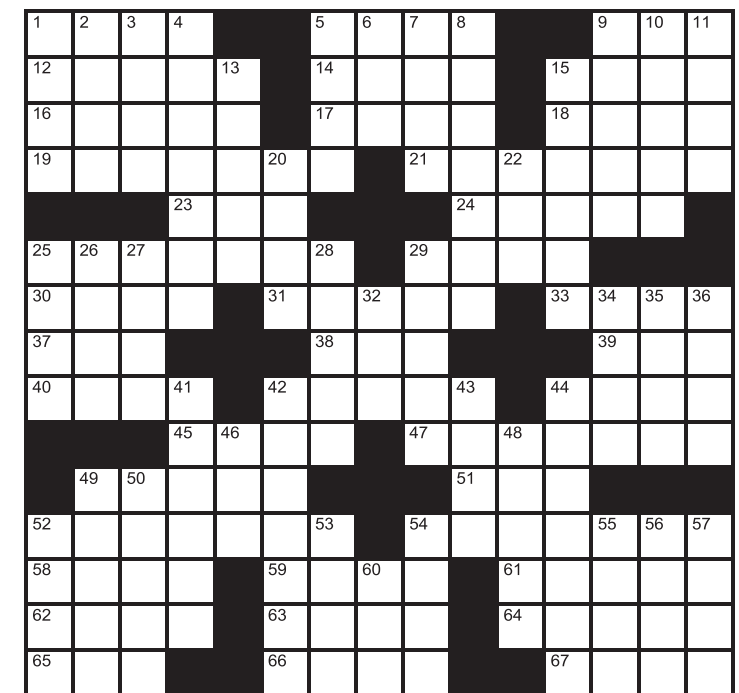

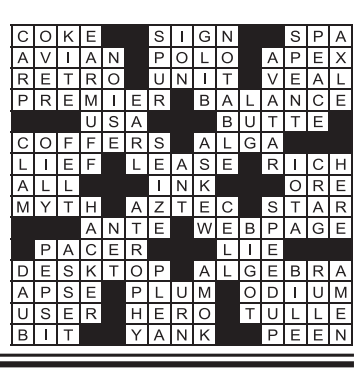

Texas Sales Tax Holiday is Aug. 7-9

(AUSTIN) — With the Texas economy slowly awakening from effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, Comptroller Glenn Hegar reminds shoppers they can save money on clothes and school supplies during the state's sales tax holiday on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 7-9.

The law exempts sales tax on qualified items — such as clothing, footwear, school supplies and backpacks — priced below \$100, saving shoppers about \$8 on every \$100 they spend. The date of the sales tax holiday and list of tax-exempt items are set by the Texas Legislature.

"Even though significant uncertainty remains for our public and private schools

as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the sales tax holiday is a perfect opportunity to save money on school supplies and other tax-free items at a time when many Texans are carefully monitoring their family finances," Hegar said. "Online shopping is covered, so I encourage all Texans to shop online or practice social distancing when making in-store purchases. money." Apparel and school supplies that may be purchased tax-free are listed on the Comptroller's website at TexasTax-Holiday.org.

To promote social distancing, the Comptroller's office wants all taxpayers to know that during the annual sales tax holiday, qualifying items

Uncertainty surrounding consumer activity in the retail sector coupled with a lack of clarity regarding the timing and nature of schools reopening prevents the agency from producing an estimate for dollars saved by taxpayers during this year's holiday. Last year's holiday generated an estimated \$102.2 million in savings for Texas taxpayers.

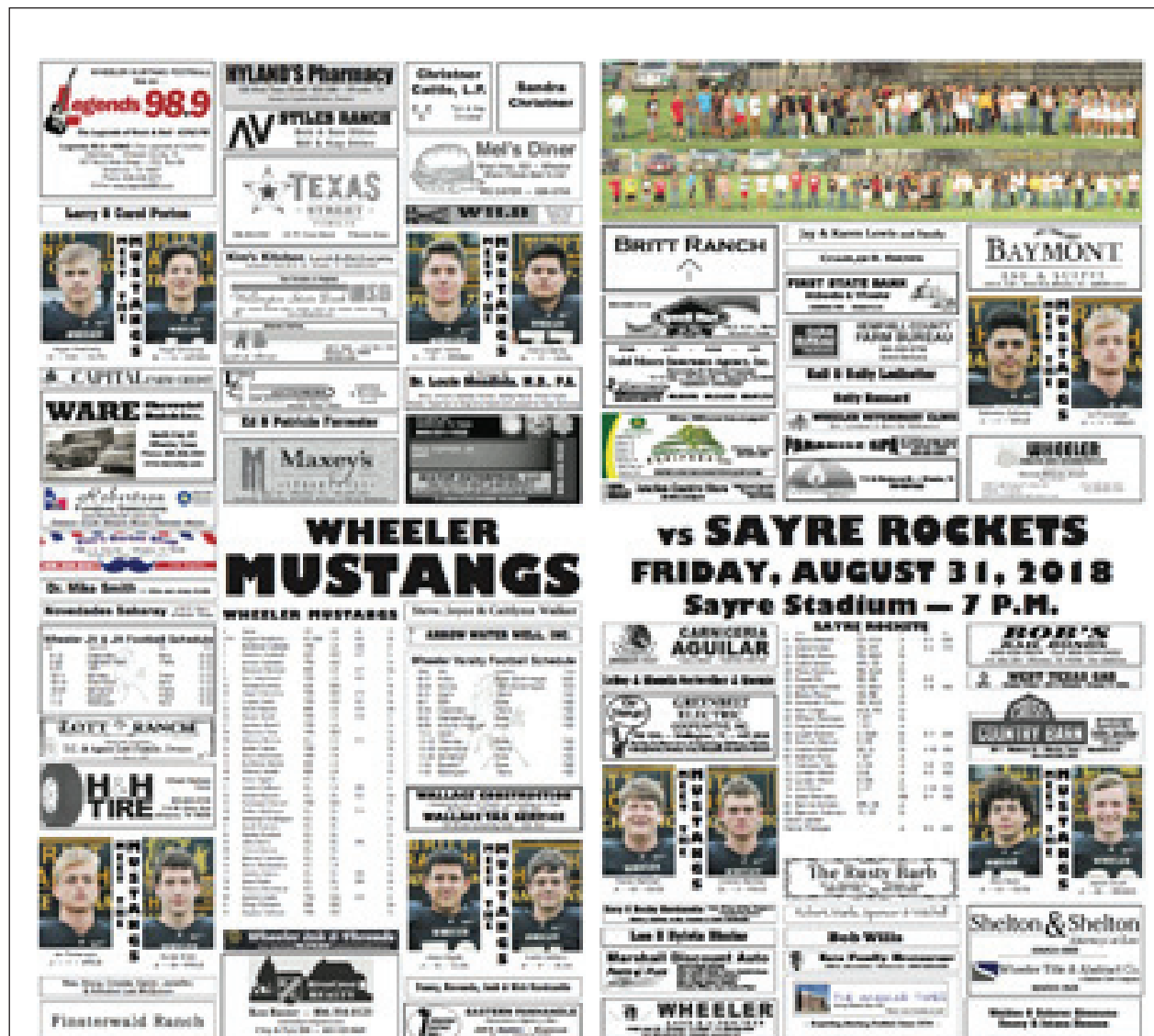
