

For an untold amount of loved its simplicity, low cost, time, or at least for millennia, and ubiquity - they were humans have been communicating via writing. The requisite tool for such is something that enables marks to be made, whether a stick with which to scribble in the dirt, or a rock that serves as a crude form of chisel to etch something in stone. Though it would seem we are moving away from paper and pen, and that they are destined to become artifacts that will be viewable in museums at a future date, driven to extinction by the advent of portable computers, tablets, and smartphones (not to mention who knows what else, yet to be developed), for the time being, paper and pen remains an effective and contemporary means of communication. Related, but far less utilized, a pencil is an alternative to the pen, and I have found myself gravitating more and more to this lowtech method over the past year or so, and now wish to expound on the virtue of the pencil.

I used to write with simple click-style ball point pen. I (Continued Page 3)






