





Merely (from Page 1) be made as to what habits or practices will lead to fulfillment or attainment of the things identified in the big-picture assessment, and those habits and practices can then be implemented into life on a daily, weekly, monthly, and yearly basis, as guideposts and guardrails to keep one on the path toward what it is one has identified as meaningful, or important, or worth pursuing. And it is an ongoing experiment, where something

has to be tried out, and modified or replaced if it does not

serve one's purpose.

I would like to note here that it is possible to become obsessed with routines, and care must be taken to prevent the routine from being made a golden calf that must be served no matter what. I believe routines ought to be able to be abandoned or suspended temporarily if needed; provided, if the routine is effective it will probably make its absence known, which will facilitate reinstatement of the routine. So it is with me recently, anyway. I feel a bit untethered and have noticed that I am not functioning as well as I typically do when I am supported by my routines.

As I wrap up this piece, I have the feeling that I have not written a particularly good one. Yet I realize I cannot afford for "particularly good" to be the standard by which these pieces are measured; suffice to say I feel as though today's product is poorer than normal. I attribute it to my lack of routine. I shall reinstate my routines this week and if I deliver another poor piece next week, I will be bereft of excuses, other than saying, "It is my routine to deliver writings of meager worth."
