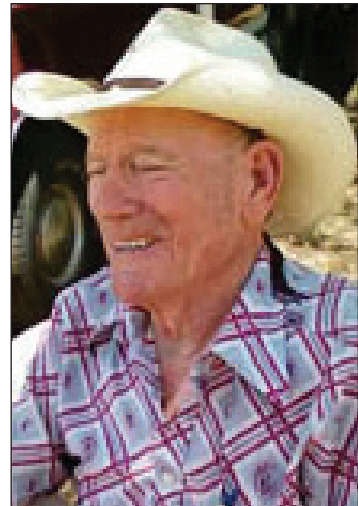

at cleaning — my attitude or my energy (or both) fail me too readily.
I suspect many people have, or have had, the intention of getting things cleaned up and organized to begin the new year, and that it is a perennial need for many. It certainly is for me, which indicates the lessons that avail themselves during the cleaning process still haven't stuck, for whatever reason. Either way, many could likely call cleaning one of their new year resolutions. Some people scoff at resolutions because they rely on the notion that something, at some point in time, will prompt things to be different than they were before, in a lasting way. But I think there is value in setting a date from which to perceive a fresh approach or new start. Just yesterday I read something that described this very concept as "temporal landmarks." I had not heard the word before — it was attributed to "social scientists." (There is a nebulous term if I have heard one — what makes one a social "scientist?" And what makes a scientist "social?" And how does one obtain those credentials? And after they have obtained them, what authority do they wield over their test subjects, that is, society?) It reminds me of the words and acronyms that are made up by academia to justify themselves and their writings — ever heard of the word "satisfice?" Therefore, in a sort of rebellion against the self-serving academics, I disclaim the weight the social scientists lend to the term temporal landmarks, though I acknowledge the concept. A more fitting way to have disclaimed the social scientists would be to not use the term coined by them in the first place, but alas, like all humanity, this column is not immune to the occasional display of hypocrisy.

As I consider where we are in this piece, I acknowledge the irony that cleaning and organizing is not even a new

year resolution of mine; it is simply something that needed to happen, and digging out of a mess seems fitting for the turn of the new year, like digging oneself out of being snowed in, at the end of winter. I have a few modest resolutions, but I am thinking of them not so much as goals, but processes. There isn't necessarily a definite objective to achieve, just habits to engrain. The lack of a clearly-defined outcome is freeing in a way, where the outcome isn't idolized, which allows the process to be what receives the focus, rather than the distant outcome. So many times it seems like outcome-oriented goals fail because

It is like trying to cross a chasm, and only looking at the other side, without building the bridge and giving adequate thought to its support structures. As a friend and mentor tells me, "progress beats perfection." So I will endeavor to make small progress, gradually, to groove the habits and processes. Then I may find that I obtain my objectives without ever having defined them, or even noticed that I had reached them. And if I happen to find one day that my closet is clean, so be it.
