





REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about June 21st, 2021 the City of Wheeler will submit a request to the Texas Department of Agriculture for the release of Community Development Block Grant funds under Section 104(f) of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 as amended, to undertake a project known as City of Wheeler, Water System Improvement Project #7220501: The City of Wheeler shall replace the elevated water storage tank and water lines to comply with Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) regulations. Contractor shall construct a new one hundred thousand gallon (100,000 gal.) elevated storage tank including project site acquisition, seven hundred fifty linear feet (750 l.f.) of eight inch (8") water line, electrical controls, pavement repair, and all associated appurtenances, to include Administrative and Engineering services and fees.

Construction of the water tank shall take place at the southwest corner of Kiowa Street and Seventh Street. Construction of the water line shall take place at the alleyway between Comanche Street and Kiowa Street, from Sixth Street to the alleyway north of Fairlane Drive.

Estimated Cost: \$275,000 (Grant Funds) and \$857,382 (City Matching Funds - City of Wheeler's General Fund) for a total project cost of \$1,132,382.



After the deadline for public comments, the executive director will consider the comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions for requesting a contested case hearing or reconsideration of the executive director's decision. If the request for contested case hearing is filed on behalf of a group or association, the request must designate the group's representative for receiving future correspondence; identify by name and physical address an individual member of the group who would be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity; provide the information discussed above regarding the affected member's location and distance from the facility or activity; explain how and why the member would be affected;

PUBLIC COMMENT / PUBLIC MEETING. You may submit public comments or request a

and explain how the interests the group seeks to protect are relevant to the group's purpose.

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the executive director will forward the application and any requests for reconsideration or for a contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their timely comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact or mixed questions of fact and law relating to relevant and material water quality concerns submitted during the comment period.
