sole would best suit my feet. After that, the worker took the insole, which was comprised a number of pads approxipads on the bottom and inch pads on the bottom, and she in, or somehow manipulated the pads to match what the foot-scanning machine directed. The idea was that it would be a tailored insole according to the actual image of my foot.
I don't recall if this insole caused me any further pain, but I don't recall it remedying the problem either. At some
point I got tired of wearing inpoint I got tired of wearing in-
soles with artificial humps and soles with artificial humps and curves, and decided I would return to the standard insoles that my shoes had had before sought intervention. That, and I determined that if my feet were going to stop hurting, they were going to have to support my weight themselves, without the aid of orhotics/prosthetics. Attemptitself involved body resolve the frequency increasing the frequency of occasions where my body was in its nat ural state, i.e. barefoot. In my smple way of viewing things, opportunity to strengthen the structures strengthen strengthening. If someone strengthening. If someone day, how strong would that individual's feet and associated musculature be? The other intervention I did was to try to slightly stretch the muscles of the foot, and of the calf. Often when pain manifests in a particular joint, it can be caused by a tight muscle pulling that joint too hard in a certain direction, but the problem can be disguised because the source of the trouble may not necessarily be the place the pain manifests.
I suppose what I have written this week is a way of justifying my non-interventionist stance regarding foot pain. place for intervention, but in my case the problem was not resolved by 21 st century technology, but a return to a state of being which more closely approximated the state. And that my problem resolved, I am profoundly grateful.
