Merely (from Page 1) that mandate themselves, or if one of their overlords might have given that directive, or at least encouraged it. It doesn't matter much; just a curiosity. Either way, nothing says punk like siding with big government and big pharma. Nothing says punk and non-conformity like aligning with and participating in, and mandating for their would-be fans, group-think and group-act, and denying the ability to ask questions or possess an independent thought; nothing says anti-fascism like segregating the public into groups, with different groups possessing different rights based on whether they have acted in accordance with the mandate.

The musicians are free to do what they want - as far as I can see know one's civil rights are being violated, as a musician might be free to deny performance to anyone, but for anyone who is paying attention and willing to invest an ounce of thought, the mu-

sicians in question have revealed themselves for what they are: corporate punks, and intellectual frauds. For anyone who has been paying attention to them (and one would be forgiven if one hasn't ever paid any attention to them), the illusion was probably shattered long ago, but I thought this story was exceedingly revealing and ironic, though not surprising. The thing that is confusing is that the Covid shot has not yet been granted emergency use authorization for those younger than 12, so what is juvenile portion of their fan base supposed to do? Based on the lyrics of the songs I have heard, it appears they target a young audience, or those with an underdeveloped prefrontal cortex.

I am not an anti-vaccine person in general, and I am in favor of the public possessing health, and also wish for no one to be sickened by the coronavirus. But I am against turning the Covid vaccine into a club with which to bash people and their rights. I believe there are many good questions concerning the Covid vaccine, which have not been satisfactorily answered or even given consideration.

Meanwhile, there are many other behaviors known to jeopardize one's health, such as smoking, drug usage, alcohol abuse, etc. I wonder if Green Day will prohibit those engaging in those activities from attending their concerts. Perhaps to gain entry, one must present along with their ticket, an affidavit stating that he or she had exercised on the day of the performance. I do not know what the answer is or who to trust, but I have no reason to believe that the would-be punks in question are the possessors of the best medical information, or have my best interests at heart in general. If they did, they might write better music.
