It is called neuroplasticity, the finding that the brain can be re-trained, or re-patterned, and new neural connections can be formed, tending toward patterns of more desirable behavior. I probably have done an injustice to the description of the concept here, but it is there for anyone who wishes to look into it, to find it properly described.


