
Richard Lee Gaines, 91, of Wheeler died Thursday, October 21, 2021, in Wheeler.

matters; what matters is to get going again.

An application of this principle which is easy enough to envision, or encountered commonly enough, can be found concerning exercise. I would venture that everyone who has ever formed any habit of exercise has experienced this falling away from the practice, for any number of reasons, both avoidable and unavoidable. The temptation is to despair and moan about the current failed state of being; the remedy is to get going again. A psychological obstacle that may be encountered when considering getting going again is that performance matching the pre-lapse level is unlikely. This is where the principle of doing something imperfectly

is applied. In that state of frustration, forget your monument of achievement and resort to doing something halfway there. Lower the hurdle of find yourself. But none of that expected performance, and just do something. Then the much closer when you start. I've found that often, progress represents itself in the form of a sine wave, with times of ascension, when things are progressing well, followed by lapses, times of descent and backsliding. Progress from a long-term perspective may look like a sine wave which is tilted upward, at some angle of incline. The key is to get going again as quickly as possible when encountering a valley, and hopefully each valley will be not be quite as low as the one that preceded it. But even if it is, start climbing again.

My sense is that this piece represents a ride down the slope of the valley; if so it mirrors my overall state of balance at the moment. But I shall write again next week, and will eventually find the incline again. It is always there, waiting to be discovered again, so long as the path is not abandoned.






