

I have observed that among the most helpful ways to emerge from a slump like this is to draw from the well of spirituality – to reinvigorate the pursuit of spiritual enrichment, which is to say the pursuit of God himself. When the other institutions showed their colors, nothing was left to aid the common man but God himself. The concept of God almighty is what can imbue an otherwise dire circumstance with hope. It is what allowed people to stand, individually, against the hell on earth which was known as the Soviet Union. Hell on earth bears many other names and figures at the moment, but belief in God is still the antidote and is what can empower a person to be free enough to hope, and to live the truth amidst the tyranny of pervasive falsehood. Inversely, this is why the atheistic, secular humanists cannot tolerate believers, especially those who believe enough to hope in virtue, justice, and mercy in the

face of tyranny and brutality. I spoke to someone not too long ago who suggested that the collective malaise many have observed in our country is because we have moved away from God.
