Remaining with the theme explored over the past two weeks, another avenue that tends to lead its travelers out of slumps is the practice of virtue. Virtue is an ancient concept which remains ever-relevant, similar to justice, and it can be said that justice is a virtue; thus comparing them is sort of folding the cloth back over itself.

Virtue – how might one define thee? Without consulting a dictionary, I would say it is the highest ideals to which man may aspire – things like justice, mercy, righteousness, devotion, fidelity, generosity, honesty, humility – sort of a tool box filled with the qualities that humans have found admirable for ages, and that enable one to live a fruitful, meaningful life that benefits the practitioner of virtue. And,

since no life occurs in a vacuum, a virtuous life also benefits the lives touched by the practitioner, and the world at large.

The pursuit and practice of virtue remains one of the simplest, yet most challenging keys to unlocking a rich life. It can lead to material prosperity, or it might demand poverty be selected if the alternative is violating virtue's precepts. And the virtuous poor will be more content than the dishonest wealthy. One needn't look too far to see examples of magnificently wealthy people whose personal lives lacked virtue and thus were a disaster, moving from one shipwreck to another.

I speak about virtue and yet, I speak as a hypocrite who continues to fail to attain

to virtue: like a painting with a hole punched in the canvas; like a climber who falls seven times a day and gives up the ascent out of fatigue and frustration, and instead boards a trolley hoping it will deliver the rider to the summit, only to find there is no other way than the difficult path of virtuous strain.

The irony is that even though the pursuit of virtue might make life more difficult, it makes it more content. There appears to be a universal law that there is no true or deep contentment without effort and strain; there is no pride except that which is earned (I am speaking of virtuous pride; the character flaw known as pride is often an attempt to cover for the lack of virtue and/or the proud satisfaction which is earned through effort).

Virtue is the path to happiness because it yields the satisfaction that one has striven toward what they know is true, good, noble, and beautiful. This always yields satisfaction. It is why people who are in such a state have a clear conscience and can remain joyful amidst persecution or maltreatment - though their rights may have been violated, they have not violated their very selves. It is why they can be wrongly incarcerated and be at peace. It is why they can be courageous in the right, amidst the forces of wrong united in oppression against them. It is why the poet's words are true: "If you're free you'll never see the walls; if you're right you'll never fear the wrong."

I believe in a concept I would describe as freedom through virtue - without virtue there is no true (inner) freedom; with virtue there is freedom and peace. This is true and available for all, on the individual level. It also is applicable to the collective, i.e. society, the collection of individuals. When people pursue virtue in their individual lives, virtue flourishes in the

collective. External freedom is merely the result of enough people with internal freedom being together, i.e. in a society, and pursuing the noble idea of virtuous liberty. Liberty without virtue is license, which is the path to depravity, a state of non-freedom, true for the individual and the collective.

So it is that virtue is beneficial for all, and yet it is often the more difficult option available, one our lower selves will resist with all their might. Pursuing it is a lot of work; it will not be without frustration and questioning. So be it. Pursuing virtue is like climbing up a hill...but how else does one emerge from a valley?

for elementary students, to extend and to renovate an outdated science laboratory, to add an auxiliary gymnasium, and to provide extensive safety updates for the entire campus. Our students, faculty and community have been able to utilize and to enjoy the conveniences these updates provided.

Our prekindergarten and kindergarten classes are currently located in the new elementary addition where we have large classrooms that provide room for centers and other age-appropriate activities. The classroom area also provide a safety corridor, utilized during the possibility of impending weather. All high school science courses have the ability to utilize the spacious and modern science laboratory. The auxiliary gymnasium has provided additional space for extracurricular activities and community youth sports activities. And finally, the safety updates throughout the building have added a much needed barrier for the safety of all of our students. Again, on behalf of Wheeler ISD, thank you.

The district, along with the board of trustees, proactively sought to provide tax savings for the future. With that being said, Wheeler ISD, along with LiveOak Financial Group, recently had the opportunity to resale (refinance) our approved bonds for a substantial savings to the district. After completing the resale in late October, the district will be able to save the taxpayers an estimated \$900,000 over the maturity of the current bonds. This reduction in interest payments will allow for either lower yearly payments or the possibility of paying the bond off two to three years earlier than expected.

Most of the time, understandably, we utilize our message for promoting our students and their accomplishments. That is the reason we are all here and diligently working each day! However, it is a proud moment when we get to share that our efforts as stewards of taxpayer dollars are being utilized to the fullest. Thank you for your continued sup-

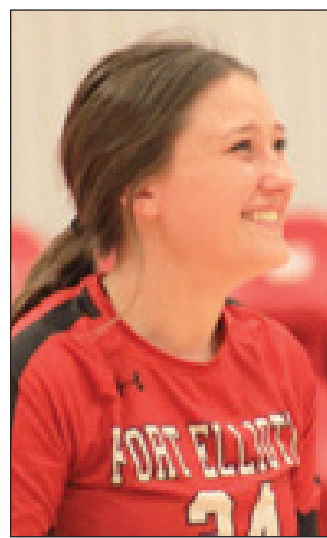

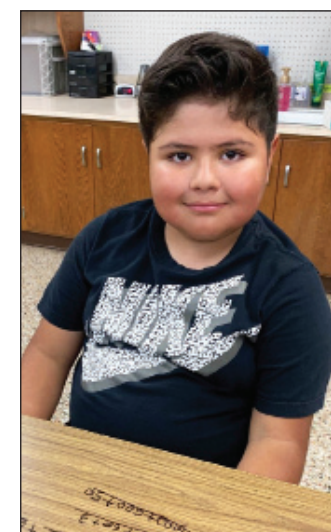

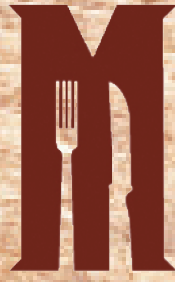
