Merely Mustard

I found myself a bit amused this past week after skimming a story about the musician Neil Young and his request to have his music removed from the platform Spotify. As best as I understand, Spotify is an audio streaming platform which presumably owns licenses to the rights of audio recordings, including without limitation music and podcasts, and provides its

subscribers the right to play ("stream") those files. I am not a user of it, nor do I possess much knowledge of it, though I am generally opposed to the company because I believe it has helped turned music into a valueless commodity, by creating the unrealistic expectation in listeners that music is created, produced, and made available free of cost. Ask any creator

of any kind whether their creation was devoid of cost. Nonetheless, I do not intend to make this piece about Spotify, but I felt as though a brief description of the company was a necessary prelude to the content herein, and I could not serve up such an appetizer without seasoning it with my opinion.

repository for a podcast hosted by an individual named Joe Rogan, who made some comments I have not heard concerning the Covid injections. The musician Mr. Young seems to have gotten fairly disgruntled by some comments Mr. Rogan made (though to a casual observer such as myself, it seems Mr. Young abides in a state of perpetual disgruntledness – some people seem to refuse to be happy about anything). I wonder if anyone has ever been flustered by comments made by Mr. Young, or the music he has made? A better question might be: I wonder if Mr. Young has somehow failed to consider at least the possibility that people might have been flustered by any comments he has made? The answer to such a question would reveal much: either the presence of a double-standard which Mr. Young might justify only by claiming a sense of superiority; or, a total lack of introspection and perspective, which generally causes individuals bereft of these attributes to not hold stances that prove to be particularly durable under scrutiny.

Mr. Young issued a sort of ultimatum to the Spotify company, insisting that they remove either Rogan's or Young's content from their platform – coexistence be damned. Young's gripe was, "I am doing this because Spotify is spreading fake information about vaccines – potentially causing death

to those who believe the disinformation being spread by them." The usage of the word "vaccine" to describe the Covid injections might be a form of disinformation itself – at least until the CDC changed their definition of "vaccine" in September 2021 to include products which do not provide immunity to their recipients. Last year the CDC discarded the definition that a vaccine is "a product that stimulates a person's immune system to produce immunity to a specific disease..." in favor of the new, more wobbly, less inspiring definition that a vaccine is "a preparation that is used to stimulate the body's immune response against diseases." By that logic, taking a vitamin is a vaccine. So is exercise, sleep, de-stressing, meditation, counting one's blessings, possibly reading this newspaper, and so on.

Back on point, Mr. Young claims to be concerned with disinformation. Great. Has he ever spread disinformation in song, or speaking to his audience in concert? What if some individuals view the lyrics to his songs as disinformation? I am not very well versed in Mr. Young's work, but I suspect the opportunities to point out hypocrisy would be nearly endless, as they are for just about everyone whose name is not Jesus. Regardless, I suspect Mr. Young now considers himself a sort of martyr for the truth. So be it. It doesn't matter much to me, but I thought it would make an enjoyable column. That and I

find amusing the hypocrisy when corporate musicians who are paid handsomely for speaking their minds, then get bent out of shape when someone else also speaks their mind. And it is particularly rich when the rock & rollers who musically give lip service to concepts of freedom and the plight of the common man then side with big pharma and big government. It turns out that freedom cuts a thin line.

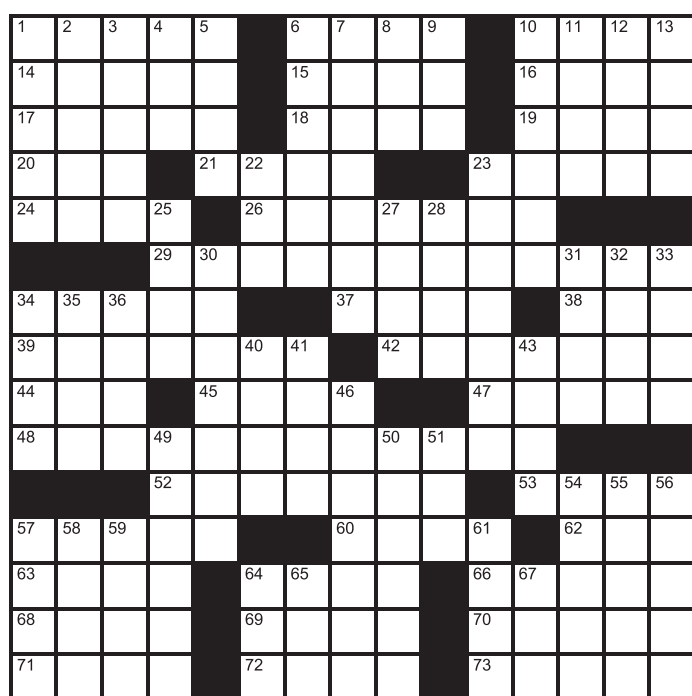

CSP participants earn an annual payment for five years which enables them to achieve a greater level on conservation and stewardship. Whether you are looking to improve grazing conditions, increase crop resiliency, or develop wildlife habitat, NRCS can custom design a CSP plan to help you meet those goals. For existing CSP contract holders whose contracts are

expiring in 2022, the deadline to submit those applications for the 2022-1 CSP-Renewal sign up will be March 31, 2022. Special provisions are available for historically underserved producers, which include those considered beginning, socially disadvantaged and limited resource as well

as military veterans. These producers are targeted funds. Interested producers should contact and submit these applications to their local NRCS office by the deadlines listed above. For additional information about CSP Classic or CSP-Renewals, contact your local USDA service center.

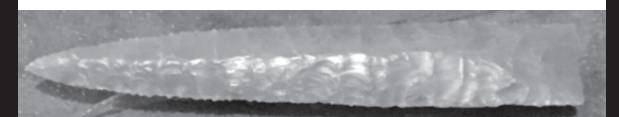

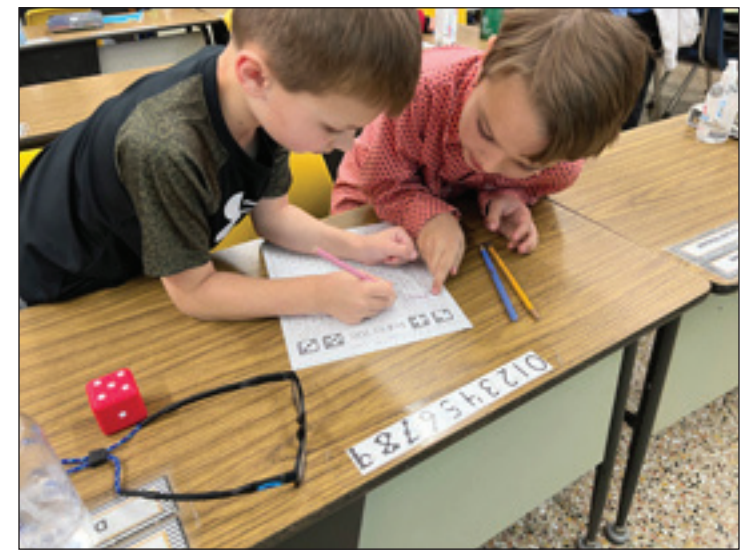
