Wheeler County Commissioners' Court New Floor For Dist. CSCD Office

The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County, Texas, met in regular session on Monday, December 12, 2022, at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse at 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern and to take action on the following agenda items.

At 10:00 court was reconvened to address the 16 items on the agenda.

- The court approved the minutes of the previous meetings.
- The court accepted the reports from the Justices of the Peace, Tax Assessor, Treasurer, County Clerk and District Clerk.
- There were no Budget Amendments presented.
- There were no Budget Transfers presented.
- No line-item transfers were presented.
- No action was taken on the Wheeler County Policy Manual.
- No action was taken on the Burn Ban.
- Nichole Mock, County Auditor, reported on the audit Reports for the Jail Commissary, Jail Bonds and Jail Inmate Trust. Corrections were being made.
- Judge Pat McDowell reported the completion of Public Information Act and Open Meetings Act training as mandated by the Texas Government Code Secs 552.012 and 531.005.
- The court discussed the purchase of new Wheeler County Jail camera system and decided to do some further investigation before acting.
- Nichole Mock reported the American Rescue Plan Act has \$75,000 for each of the six Wheeler County volunteer Fire Departments. It was determined for the departments to use the money for new equipment.
- The court appointed the present Wheeler County Historical Commission board to another two years. Members of the board are Ada Lou Lester, Leroy and Rhonda Meriwether, Rhonda Gallagher, Ken Baxter, James Hubble and Suzanne Lohberger.

The court voted to take bids for county road materials. Bids will be opened December 28.

The court approved the placing of vinyl flooring for the 31st District CSCD Probation Office at a cost of \$9,464.50.

The court approved the paying of the bills in the amount of \$144,989.93.

The Wheeler Mustangs Basketball Teams have had a busy schedule as they played a full week of games last week. The Junior Varsity Girls started off Tuesday's games with a 37-6 win against McLean. Rheadyn Robles came out strong early in the first quarter with 6 points and the Lady Stangs held McLean to only one point for the half. The rest of McLean's points came late in the 4th quarter after a strong defensive stand by the Mustangs. Robles ended the night with 14 points along with 9 points by Kynslee Marshall to lead the girls to victory.

Following JV was the Varsity girls who fell 35-39 with the biggest deficit coming in the first quarter when the Lady Tigers out scored the Lady Stangs 2-9. In the words of Coach Finsterwald, “Two point quarters will kill you!”

Merely Mustard

This past week, I skimmed a story to the effect that Elon Musk, the owner of several large companies and, depending on who you believe, is a sort of mastermind, or brilliant fool, has announced plans for one of his companies to develop or complete a ‘chip’ that can be implanted in a human brain (presumably while the brain carrier is still living). I was immediately, instinctively, reflexively dismissive. It seemed like such

gimmicky, such a manipulation of the mystery of life, and far too uncertain to be for the good of the humans whose brains would be implanted individually, or that of humanity as a whole.

To a degree, all medicine might be viewed as a sort of manipulation of the mysteries of life, but the rise of techno-overlords, in conjunction with the rise of mega-medical corporate (or perhaps mega-medical) entities,

viewed through the lens of the mishandled, deceptive, covered-up, incredibly misstated, mismanaged, fraudulent, harmful, destructive, and massively fatal maneuvers over the past 3 years, by a collusion between corporate, medical, governmental, and techno autocrats, the worst of which (the injections) being ongoing, persisting despite the surfacing of overwhelming evidence as to their potential for grave harm, evidence

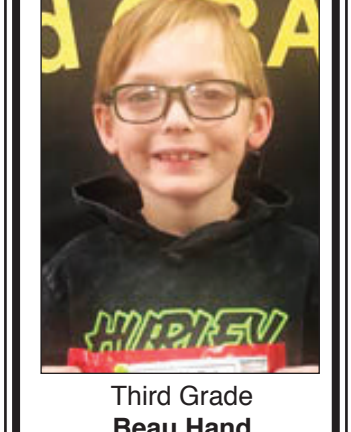

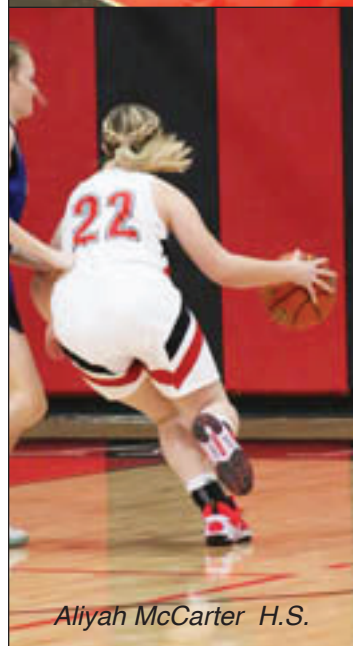
