of the many things I don't understand in this world is the insistence on the part of many footwear manufacturers to put arch-supporting insoles into their shoes. I think of the last few pairs of boots I've tried on, all but one of them have had these insoles. It is common enough that one might conclude that the whole world must have arch-support problems, and need a prosthesis to remedy - no, that is the wrong word - to offset the problem.

Until I noticed how frequently arch-support insoles are used, by several different footwear manufacturers,

I never would have thought much of the need for arch-supporting structures. It may be a lesson I will learn someday, but at present I can't understand it. It seems to me that putting arch-supporting insoles in all (or many) shoes by default could be likened to manufacturing a mattress with a hump in the middle of it, for the purpose of "supporting" the void created by the natural curvature of the spine. As of yet, I know of no mattress manufacturer who does this, but it wouldn't surprise me if it were coming.

And even if arch supports were needed by everyone, it

isn't possible that they would be needed to the same degree of firmness or curvature, by everyone. One of the more innovative designs, though archaic, was a shoe that contained internal air bags which could be inflated to supposedly create a custom fit. I think it was made by Reebok. If I'm not mistaken, it was a basketball shoe. Basketball shoes are the ultimate opportunity for footwear swindles, in my view, so perhaps the Reebok pump system was all for show. I don't recall any mechanism to deflate the shoes, though there might

I don't desire the complexity of an inflatable insole, although I do see value in the concept of an insole which is customizable. And the nice thing about the idea of an inflatable insole is that anything flexible enough to be inflated is also flexible enough to be punctured, and lose its ability to be inflated, and if that were the case, I might finally get my wish and have an OEM insole without an arch support.

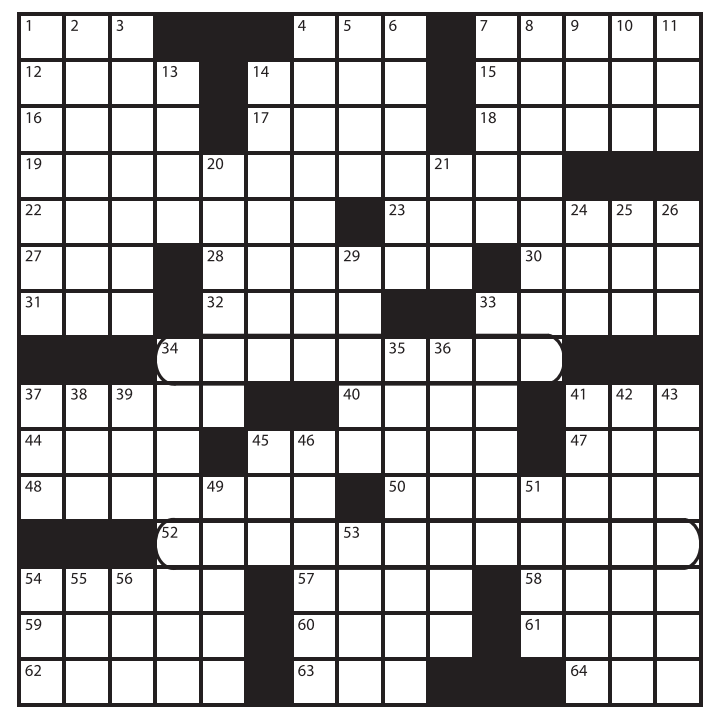

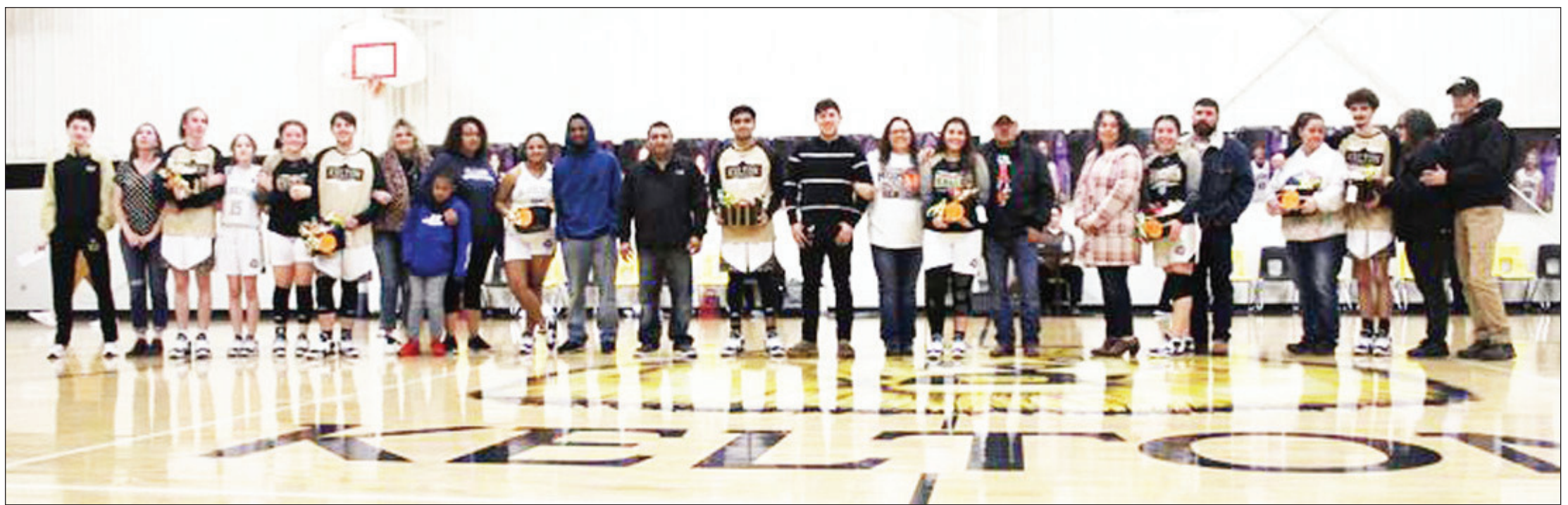
