Weather was predicted. - cwe -

Jennifer called to see if we had taken shelter; she had seen on television that Wheeler was advised that Wheeler's Sirens were being sounded due to an approaching tornado. We had been watching recorded TV programs and heard no sirens.

- cwe -

Turning on the TV, there was advisory for the northern part of the panhandle. I called Dr. Mike Smith to see if they heard the sirens; they hadn't since they were out of town. I called Lyndon Loyd, who was also out of town, but a neighbor had called him to say he had heard the same broadcast as Jennifer.

- cwe -

Looking out it was a very nice spring evening with lightly clouded skies and a gentle breeze-for Wheeler. A little later I did hear that a cloud was spotted in Gray County approaching Interstate 40.

- cwe -

In the mean time, we raised the bed, out under the bed storm shelter, opened the doors, turned on the battery operated light and placed several items, including the Times computer.

- cwe -Barbara watched the TV for further information.

- cwe -

Around 8 the wind came up and a little rain and hail fell with some lightning in the distance; judging distance by the fact that we heard no thunder.

At 10 we removed everything from the shelter, put down the bed and I was up watching programs until 1. — cwe —

I learned at the post office Monday morning that rain and high winds hit Kelton around midnight and a storm had killed one person at Chevenne.







## **Settlement Notice**

On October 28, 2022, Southwestern Public Service Company ("SPS"), doing business as Xcel Energy, filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("Commission") to implement an interim net surcharge to collect \$59,579,557.39 in under-collected fuel costs incurred from March 2022 through August 2022, plus interest. The Application was supplemented on November 17, 2022, to incorporate the Commission-approved interest rate.

The docket number assigned to this proceeding is Commission Docket No. 54282. This filing was made pursuant to 16 Texas Administrative Code § 25.237(a)(3)(B). The filing affects only the fuel portion of the rates charged by SPS for electricity in Texas and has no effect on SPS's non-fuel base rates. This application, if granted, will affect all Texas retail customers who pay fixed fuel factors.

The parties in Docket No. 54282 have reached a settlement whereby, in addition to the \$59,579,557.39 in under-collected fuel costs SPS incurred from March 2022 through August 2022, SPS will also include in its surcharge \$10,500,000, which constitutes approximately half of its under-collected fuel expenses during September 2022. Including interest in the amount of \$627,910.02, the total amount of the surcharge that SPS proposes to collect is \$70,707,467.41. Under the terms of the settlement, the surcharge would be collected over a 10-month period. The amount of the surcharge will be based on each customer's historical usage. The final amount of the surcharge will be determined by the Commission. The parties in Docket No. 54828 request that the surcharge be effective for the period April 1, 2023, through January 31, 2024.

The effect of the interim net surcharge on customer bills will vary depending on the rate schedule under which a customer takes service. Because the fuel surcharge resulting from Docket No. 53556 will terminate on March 31, 2023, after the proposed interim net surcharge is applied a residential customer using 1,000 kWh per month and a secondary general customer using 14,800 kWh per month will receive a monthly impact of \$(0.55) and \$(32.86), respectively. These changes will be subject to final review by the Commission in SPS's next fuel reconciliation proceeding. The table below presents how the surcharge will affect a representative customer for each service class or subclass, except Large General Service – Transmission because the surcharge amount for that class will be based on individual historical usage:
