





On February 8, 2023, Southwestern Public Service Company ("SPS"), doing business as Xcel Energy Inc., filed a statement of intent and application for authority to change rates ("Application") with the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("Commission") and with each Texas municipality that has original jurisdiction over SPS's electric rates.

SPS has approximately 403,400 Texas retail customers. All customers in each of SPS's Texas retail customer classes will be affected by the relief requested in this Application.

Statement of Intent to Change Rates

SPS requests that the Commission approve an overall increase in annual base rate revenues of \$157,546,272 which represents an increase of 22% in base rate revenues (the portion of the bill not including fuel costs and rate riders) and an increase of 14% in overall adjusted revenues. The effect of the proposed rate change on individual customer classes is set forth in the section entitled "Effect on Customer Classes" below.

SPS's proposed effective date for this rate change is 35 days after the date of this filing, which is March 15, 2023. That proposed effective date is subject to suspension and extension by actions of the Commission or other regulatory authorities.

Effect on Customer Classes

The average Residential Service customer using 1,000 kilowatt-hours of energy per month will see an increase in base rates of \$13.29 per month, or 9.1%, which results in an overall increase of 10.59%, compared to the rates established in SPS's last base rate case.

Tornadoes

The next few months are "tornado season" in Texas, so a few pointers and safety tips on tornadoes are in order, says Dale Dunlap, County Agent with the Texas Cooperative Extension. Here are a few general facts about tornadoes:

**Tornadoes generally travel an average speed of 30 miles per hour but have been clocked at 70 miles an hour.

**Tornadoes normally move from southwest to northeast although their direction of travel can be erratic and change suddenly.

**Tornadoes are often spawned in thunderstorms that have accompanying large hail.

**Most tornado damage is caused by violent winds but most tornado injuries and deaths re-

sult from flying debris. **Tornado winds may produce a loud roar similar to that of a train or airplane.

**Tornadoes can occur with little or no warning although most

**In mobile homes or vehicles, leave and take shelter in a substantial structure. If non is available, lie flat in the nearest ditch or ravine and shield your head with your hands.

The key to surviving severe weather such as a tornado is prior planning. All family members should know where the safest areas of the home are in event of threatening weather.

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
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
