Merely Mustard

I was thinking this morning, for some random reason, about a book I read a couple of years ago. It is a novel of almost 1,100 pages, and I was thinking about some of the interactions of the characters and just marveling that someone could write all of that, in a coherent way. Then I wondered whether the author

had had all of the inner workings of the characters in mind when she had set out to write, and I thought almost certainly that she had not. “Well, then, how did she develop the story and the drama between characters,” I wondered, and I decided that most likely, she just put it together as she

went along. I imagine there was some loose construct but I also imagine that the novel and the characters took particular turns and engaged in particular actions and dialogues on the fly, as it were, as the author was writing.

So it must be with any project – that the entire creation

cannot be envisioned at the beginning, but takes final shape as it is being constructed. Something that might be an exception is constructing a building – with professional engineers and computer-aided designs, maybe those plans are exact and un-

I believe there can be value in holding space for the unknown, for a project to take a shape of its own, a place for the magical coming-together that a story, a painting, a piece of music, a child in the womb, can undergo. And for those gifted creators who give us such works, I imagine that they are simply, to some degree, an instrument who guides the self-construction of such a project, like a hand which is holding a pen and steering it as the words are writing themselves. Those professionals in that case are flowing downstream on a river, and simply steering to avoid hazards or taking an incorrect fork; they are freestyle rifting and simply doing what they are gifted to do; they are hang-gliding and avoiding crash landings while they enjoy the view and the energy which carries them; they are surfing while the power of the sea lifts, accelerates, and propels them. And this explains in part how a story can swell to 1,100 pages — the author caught a continuous set of waves and stayed on the board long enough to write that much. It also might explain how a reader can stay with a novel for 1,100 pages — they caught the wave as well.
