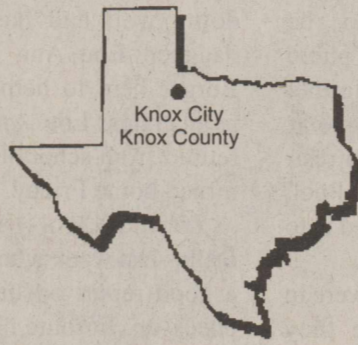


If you would like to donate items for our garage sale, please bring the items to the care home **before** Friday, December 3.

Veterans Day celebration draws over 250 people

Over 250 people supported the annual Veterans Day celebration and hamburger meal Thursday, November 11, 2004, in Benjamin.

The morning's program opened at 10:30 with the Munday Purple Cloud Band playing as the crowd gathered at the Knoxville Veterans Memorial.

Charles Baker, World War II and Korea veteran from Munday, again served as master of ceremonies, who first called for a moment of silence for all veterans who have made the supreme sacrifice and for those who even at

the time were standing in harm's way. Following Baker's opening remarks the invocation was given by John Gillespie, World War II veteran and the Knoxville County Service Officer. Everyone was welcomed by Travis Floyd, County Judge-elect. Next on the program was posting of the colors by American Legion Post 229 and VFW Post 1035, followed by Benjamin Elementary School students leading the crowd in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Cody Propps of Benjamin and Zach Shaver of Knoxville next

delivered their winning speeches based on information of their grandfathers' military service, while the crowd viewed their winning posters.

Raymond Otis Burnett who died at sea when the *Monogham* was sunk in 1944 in the Pacific was honored. His daughter, Charlotte Dudding of Cleburne, and two sons Mike and Mark, placed a Memorial Wreath honoring him and other Knoxville veterans.

The program closed with Taps and Travis Floyd leading the Star Spangled Banner.

A historical exhibit in the courthouse featured information about American war and military history; Knoxville County connections shown included the Texas Revolution, the Civil War, World War I, World War II, Korea and Vietnam.

Exhibit organizers are hopeful the 2005 exhibit will be in the long awaited museum building as the building foundation was poured November 11, the same day as the Veterans Day program. Next year it is hoped exhibits will include items from veterans of Desert Sand, Afghanistan and Iraq.

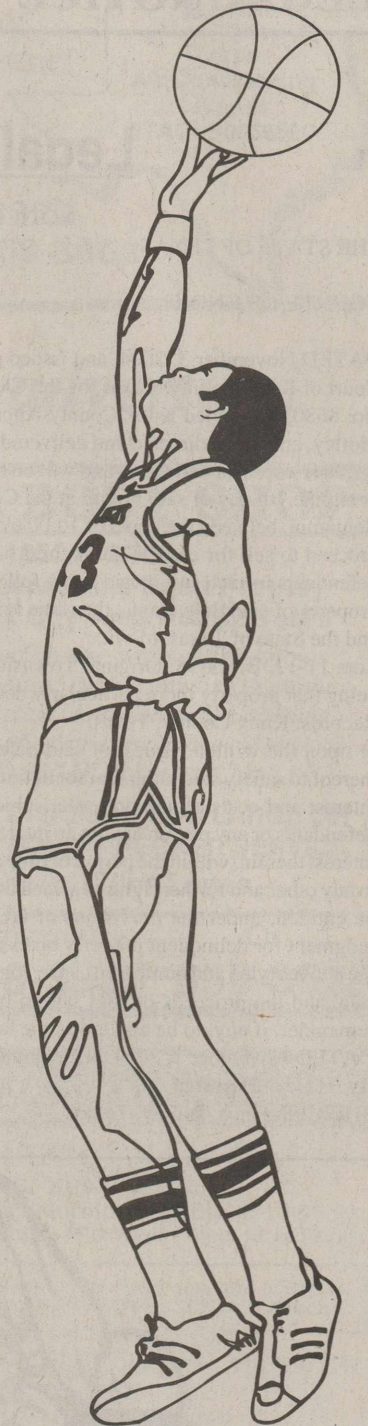

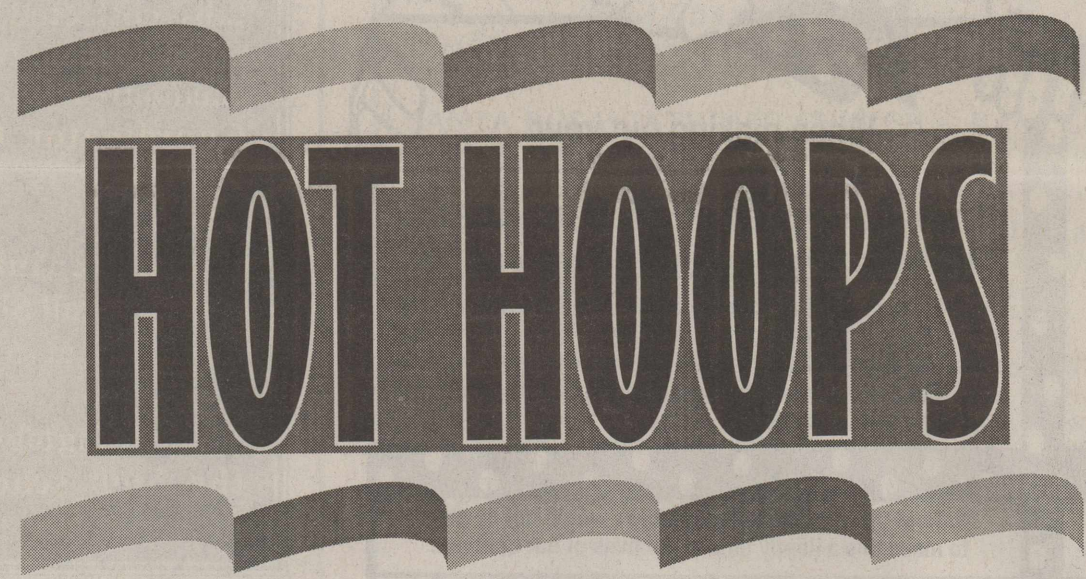
