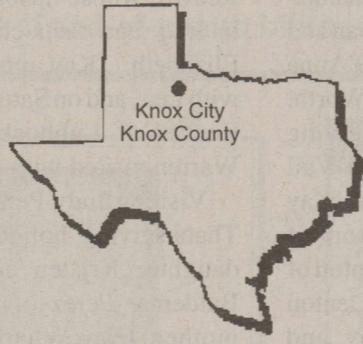

Child welfare angel tree gifts needed Dec. 10

The Angel Tree ornaments, a project of the Knox City Child Welfare Board, are on the traditional tree at The Art Stall and Frame Shop.

Each ornament lists the sex and age of a needy child in the community, along with a 'Wish' to help make their holiday more enjoyable.

Donors are then asked to purchase one set of clothing in the stated size and one toy.

Board members ask that those participating return their gifts unwrapped no later than December 10.

Participants of the Angel Tree project may team up with a friend to provide for the child.

According to Peggy Guinn with the Child Welfare Board, about 100 children were aided by the Angel Tree project last year.

Already this year, the Knox County Child Welfare Board has over 70 names and are expecting more.

The Child Welfare Board appreciates the community's generous help with making the children have a merry holiday.

Board members note that it is through these acts of love and kindness of the community and the area that the Board is able to make this a happy time for those children who are aided by this annual project during the holiday season.

The Texas Department of Health will conduct an immunization clinic at the Perry Patton Community Center in Monday on Thursday, December 2, from 9:30 - 11:30 a.m. and 1:30 - 4:00 p.m.

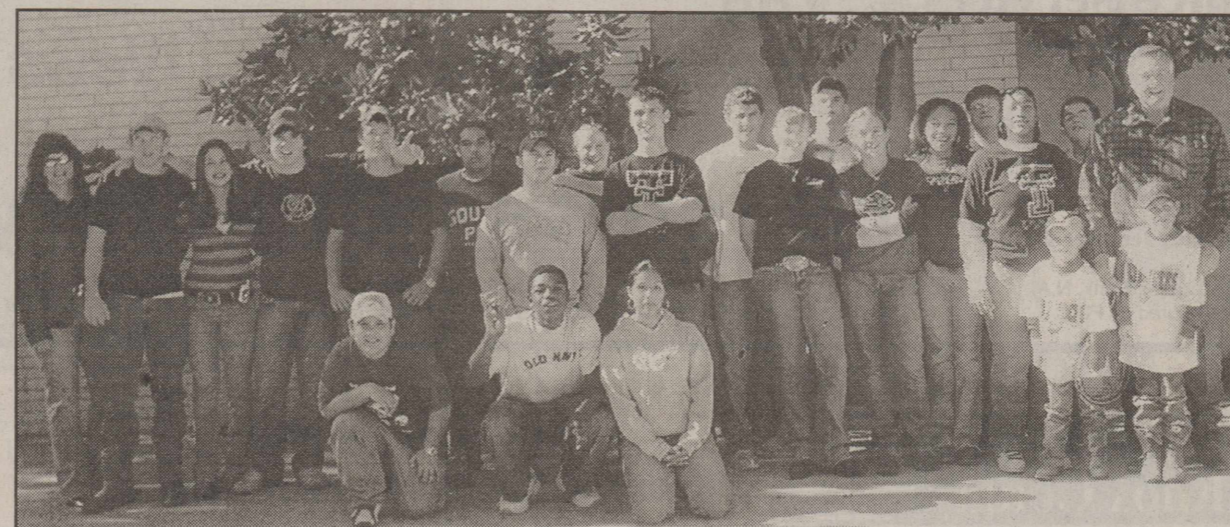
DTaP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B and Chickenpox for children entering school will be available as well as other immunizations for adults, infants and children. Influenza vaccines will be available for high risk children as well as adults. There will be a \$10.00 donation for flu and \$15.00 for pneumonia shots.

A parent, adult family member or guardian must accompany a minor under 18 years of age.

Participants must bring a copy of their child's immunization records as well as their Social Security Card.

Services at the Department of Health are offered on a sliding fee scale but no one is denied services.

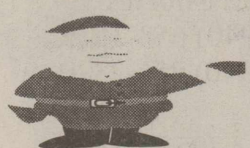
