



Qualifying/Futurity The Division classes will be on Saturday-May 24th for three age divisions-Pee Wee, Junior

and Senior. Books will open at 8:00 am and show starts at 9:00 am with all halter classes for Yearling, under 5 and over 5 mares and geldings; followed by junior/senior Western Pleasure, Western Horsemanship and Western Riding classes to complete the judged portion of the

Timed event classes will be Poles, Stakes Barrels, and Flags for Pee Wee, Junior and Senior

Tack Awards will be awarded thru 3rd place for Pee Wee classes only. High-point Award for Champion (Junior and Senior) . Judged and Timed Buckles/ Champion for (Pee Wee).

The Meinzer brothers are no strangers to cowboy work, both having worked on several ranches, including area ranches Tongue River, Moorhouse and 6666's, since they were teenag-

Graduates of Benjamin ISD, Hunter, 25, and Pate, 23, decided to come back home after brief stints away upon graduation. They decided that they could fill a niche by breaking and training horses. Being natives also helped in the decision. "We know everybody and like the area," said Hunter.

Hunter and Pate set their plans into motion in March of 2007, and the 20 stall horse barn, 150 foot cutting pen and two 150 foot cow pens were completed by August. The brothers break horses, train working cow horses and are getting into training cutting horses.

"This is a great opportunity for the boys, and for us to have them come back home, set up a business and raise their families here. This is another good opportunity for Knox County, too, to have this business located here and have Hunter and Pate offer their expertise," said Benjamin Chamber of Commerce President Mitzi Welch.

# TEXAS PRESS ASSOCIATION **State Capital** HIGHLIGHTS

AUSTIN - More than 4.2 million people voted in the March 4 Texas primaries.

This was a record-breaking turnout, far surpassing the previous record of 2.7 million in 1988.

The Republican primary, with its one person, one vote, no-caucus method, quickly yielded a winner: U.S. Sen. John McCain of Arizona with 51 percent of the vote to former Arkansas Gov. Mike Huckabee's 38 percent.

McCain received 80 del-

egates to Huckabee's 16 and Huckabee dropped out the race, as McCain had accumulated enough GOP state delegates to win the nomination.

U.S. Rep. Ron Paul of Clute, who got 5 percent of the Texas Republican vote, also ended his race for the presidential nomination.

The Democratic Party, on the other hand, revealed how engaging but messy democracy can be in actuating its "Texas Two Step" primary election process.

The state's chief election official, Secretary of State Phil Wilson, on March 4 said his office received many calls from people confused over the Democratic Party's process.

Democrats who cast ballots on March 4 or in early voting were allowed to participate in a post-election precinct cau-

Caucus goers, according to

party rules, proved they had voted as Democrats by showing the party stamp on their valid voter registration card.

Next, they signed their name and address on a sign-in sheet. Along with their name, they were asked, but not required, to declare in writing the presidential candidate of their choice.

Precinct chairs and secretaries applied a formula to the candidate declarations to calculate the number of Clinton or Obama delegates and alternates who will attend county party conventions later in March.

U.S. Sen. Hillary Clinton of New York won the popular vote with 51 percent to Illinois U.S. Sen. Barack Obama's 47 percent. The precinct caucus delegate count wasn't complete until March 7. Clinton won 65 delegates to Obama's 61.

Many thought winning Texas was a do-or-die situation for Clinton, but she bolstered her bid for the Democratic presidential nomination by also winning Ohio.







## Steps Along The Cowboy Trail

They develop the art of hangin' out and lookin' cool. Which is easier if you're a big fish in a small pond. They begin thinking, "I really am as good as they say I am!"

STEP 2: Dad and mom want him to go to college upon high school graduation. But he's got the rodeo fever. He doesn't need college. He's pairing up with a buddy whose in love with roping but doesn't have a trailer...or a horse! But they're a team. They get their picture in the Super Looper that first summer. The bug just gets stronger. The second year they get

in the top twenty of the PRCA. But their gasoline and beer expenses play havoc with their finances until...

STEP 3: The heeler attracts the attention of an equine veterinarian with a 3-horse slant, roping arena, vet clinic and 7 horses. They fall in love. He takes care of the rancho, she brings home the bacon. He gets someone to clean the stalls, feed, and shoe. He invites his friends over to rope. The relationship eventually is discontinued by her. He never does know why?

STEP 4: He's always felt he had a good way with horses, so he moves in with a trader who pays him to ride green horses. This only lasts 3 months but it's enough, in his mind to hang out this shingle and become a horse whispering clinician!

STEP 5: He develops a tech-
