



dull, you probably don't live anywhere near rats. If you live in the country, your life is not dull.

Sure, country living isn't dull for many reasons, rats being just one, except there's never just one.

At our farm, they're packrats. We could do worse. Judging from my stints in Vienna-on-the-Danube and New Orleanson-the-Mississippi, city rats are ugly, not that I've ever seen one up close by day. Rats have been around that long In case you're wondering, I didn't mortify the rat, despite my farm-girl background. Handymen L. B. and Andy handled that task. Fine with me. I deigned

not even to view the corpse,

preferring to keep city rat

If your life is images in the periphery of my imagination. I just know they're dark and have pointy noses and beady, close-set eyes. If only my images of packrats could be equally vague. But I keep encountering the critters face-to-face every time I disturb one of their so-called "nests." Picture a beaver lodge on land. Or sometimes they just add their own touches to things like stacks of old tires.

Packrats do look better than their city counterparts. Their eyes aren't as beady, their noses are less pointy, and their fur is silvery.

Behavior-wise, packrats are noted for favorite New Orleans rat shenanigans. Long story short, a packrat chewed up my Sunday shoes. Packrats and I have similar tastes. Woe is me. In fact, the black-sequined espadrilleinspired shoes were just one of four identical pairs I'd bought over a two-year time span at Wal-Mart. Naturally, the rat got the newest pair. Sequins went everywhere. It's no consolation to me that packrats and I like the same stuff. But sometimes it explains things, like the time I was under the house investigating a plumbing leak and found my colorful long-missing glasses

REMINDER TO TAXPAYERS **JANUARY 31, 2010** IS THE LAST DAY TO PAY YOUR 2009 TAXES AND AVOID THE ADDITIONAL PENALTY AND INTEREST CHARGES HOMESTEAD EXEMPTIONS

Homeowners are not required to file a homestead exemption annually. If you are already receiving the state mandated \$15,000 homestead exemption or additional over sixty-five \$10,000 exemption, you need not reapply for the taxing year of 2010. However, if you became 65 in 2009, or will become 65 in 2010, you need to apply for the additional over-65 \$10,000 exemption. If you have changed your place of residency you need to apply for a new exemption. All homestead applications must be filed with the Chief Appraiser between the dates of January 1, 2010 and May 1, 2010. These exemption forms are available at the Knox County Appraisal District Office, which is located in the Knox County Courthouse, Benjamin, Texas. Individuals who qualify for the over-65 additional homestead exemption, described above, have the option of paying their homestead taxes in four equal installments, without penalty or interest These installments are due before February 1, April 1, June 1 and August 1. If you qualify, and are interested, please contact the Knox **County Appraisal District.** 

## **AG-USE EXEMPTIONS**

Annual applications for qualifying land for agricultural use is not required. If you have been receiving the AG-USE exemption on your land in prior years, you need not reapply for the exemption. If you recently purchased a farm, you need to report this to the Chief Appraiser. AG-USE exemption forms are also available at the Appraisal District Office. Deadline for filing new exemptions are between January 1, 2010 and May 1,2010.

### **DISABLED VETERANS EXEMPTIONS**

These exemptions need not be applied annually. If you received your exemption on the 2009 tax roll, you will automatically receive it for the tax year 2010. However, if your disability percentage has changed, you need to report the change to the Chief Appraiser. Deadline for filing new exemptions are between January 1, 2010 and May 1, 2010

#### Renditions

Taxpayers are reminded that it is still their responsibility to render their personal property to the Chief Appraiser. These rendition forms are also available at the Appraisal District Office. Deadline for tax renditions is between January 1, 2010 and April 15, 2010.

# Click or Ticket campaign underway

Most of us don't spend much time thinking about safety belts. For me, buckling up is such a habit that I don't even notice doing it. But one morning earlier this year, I couldn't help but notice being buckled up. That's because I was on the side of the road, hanging upside down in my truck, held in place by nothing but my safety belt.

I was driving me and my friend Trey to the Bell County Youth Fair and Livestock Show early that morning to show our hogs. Out of nowhere, there was a loud pop, and the truck went out of control, spun end over end and landed upside down, broken in half. I reached for Trey, who was also held upside down by his safety belt, too. We were both scared to death, but alive. Looking back. I know we probably would have been thrown out of the truck and probably ended up dead if we hadn't been buckled up.

I always felt safe driving my pickup because it's so big, but after it happened,

someone told me that pickup trucks are twice as likely as cars to roll over in a serious crash. I learned that most people who aren't buckled up when they're in a rollover pickup truck crash end up dead. I'm in high school and Trey's in junior high, and I know that lots of kids our age don't buckle up. What happened to us could happen to anyone, so Trey and I have been trying to make sure everyone we know buckles up every time, no matter how far they're going.

That's why we're helping to make sure people know about TxDOT's Click It or Ticket campaign. From May 18 to May 31, troopers, sheriff's deputies and police officers are going to work long hours giving tickets to people who aren't wearing their safety belts. You can get a ticket whether you're in the front seat or if your kids aren't buckled up, and you might have to pay up to \$200, plus the cost of going to court.

Trey and I are proud to

help TxDOT get Texans to buckle up, especially people our age. Our crashed truck has been part of special Click It or Ticket events at high kids and teachers have seen it. When people see how messed up the truck is, they can't believe we're still alive. We did get a little beat up—I had a sprained ankle, Trey had some cuts on his head, a sprained wrist and a tornup shoulder. But the next day we were still able to go back to the Bell County Livestock Show and show our own animals. We even won Grand Reserve in our class.

We hope that our story and Click It or Ticket will remind more people to buckle up every single time they go anywhere. More than 1.7 million Texans who are 17 and younger aren't buckling up, so you probably know someone who needs to hear our story. Pass it on and buckle up, Texas. This long-lived severe in the Lubbock area since Macroburst of June 15th, thunderstorm developed in northeast New Mexico during the afternoon of the 30th. It then moved southeast through the South Plains roughly paralleling highway 84 all the way into the eastern Hockley and western Lubbock Counties, causing wind and hail damage all along its path. A 104 mph wind gust was reported at Reese Center. Hail piled up in streets and against fences and houses. The wind-driven hail also stripped leaves off trees. Damage was estimated at over \$100 million to property and \$70 million to crops in Lubbock and surrounding counties to the west and south.

> #3: F2 Tornado hits the town of Happy on May 5th,

There were two tornadoes in northern Swisher County on the evening of May 5th. The first developed at 6:30 pm about 5 miles west of Happy. This tornado dissipated just west of Happy around 644 pm, after causing damage to power poles and fence post. A second tornado developed shortly after the first tornado dissipated. This tornado tore a 150-yard wide path across the southern part of the town of Happy. This tornado moved east and dissipated about 6 miles east of Happy. # USDA seeks applications for household water well grants Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack today

announced the availability of funding for applications from non-profit organizations for funds to help rural homeowners construct or upgrade household water well systems.

The funding is provided through USDA Rural Development's Household Water Well System grant program.

USDA plans to award up to four grants to non-profit groups that will use the funds to establish loan program for homeowners. Loans may not exceed \$11,000 and will carry a term up to 20 years at a one percent annual interest rate.

"Because many rural residents do not live in areas where a centralized water system is feasible, it is essential that their wells are safe and working properly," said Vilsack.

The Household Water Well Grant program complements President Obama's environmental initiatives and provides support for rural residents.

USDA Rural Development plans to award

up to \$993,000 in grants. Non-profit groups must contribute at least 10 percent of the grant request. Individuals are not eligible for grants but may be eligible for loans if their annual household income does not exceed 100 percent of their state or territory's median non-metropolitan income. Loans may not be provided for home sewer or septic system projects.

The grants to be awarded under this notice are part of USDA Rural Development's annual budget and are not funded through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.

This Notice follows the November 20, 2008, release of a Notice of Solicitation of Applications that opened the application filing window. Applications are due by the close of business May 31. The application guide for this grant program can be found at http://www.usda.gov/rus/water/HWWSP

See s#2: The Olton and Tulia Tornadoes of April 21st, 2007

During the afternoon and evening of Saturday, April 21st, the South Plains and Panhandle of West Texas were hit by an outbreak of severe thunderstorms. Between the hours of 5 and 6 pm, several thunderstorms developed across the western South Plains. One thunderstorm intensified and began to rotate as it moved northeast across Lamb County. Around 7 pm, this storm produced a tornado which touched down around Fieldton (southwest of Olton) and then moved just south and east of Olton, doing damage to several structures and equipment. The thunderstorm continued to move northeast across northeast Lamb, northwest Hale, southeast Castro and southwest Swisher Counties, producing a long-lived F2 tornado (along with hail up to the size of tennis balls) which caused major damage in the town of Tulia.

#1: The Record-setting Rainfall of September 11th, 2008

From late on September 10th, to early on the 12th, numerous rain showers moved across the South Plains region. The coverage and intensity of the showers peaked on the 11th across the central South Plains. The area from Lubbock and Lynn Counties northeast to Hall and Childress counties were hit hardest as lines of heavy showers repeated tracked across this area.

Lubbock received its highest ever 24 hour rainfall - 7.80 inches. Interestingly, the previous 24-hour record (5.82 inches) was set back in October of 1983 when the area was impacted by the remnants of Pacific Hurricane

In Lubbock, the rainfall inundated the playa lakes, parks and streets across the city, and resulted in a number of flooded homes and flooded out vehicles.

# RussellGravesOutdoors New Years Resolution - Get Outside this Year - Part 1

I'm not much of a resolution maker - never have been. However, after taking a month off from writing the column, I decided it was time to resolve to make a list of reasons to get outside.

Now, I've been to the places mentioned and will probably go again but before this year ends, we should all try to get outside and do one of the following: 1) Surf Sand at Monahans

Curiously juxtaposed amid an expanse of creosote bushes, the Monahans sand dunes are something you have to see to believe. A virtual island in a Permian Basin sea, the narrow strip of sand dunes runs for 200 miles from just south of Monahans north into New Mexico and creates a unique habitat that's home to a variety of wildlife and supports one of the world's largest oak forests albeit the oaks themselves are of the diminutive shinoak variety. Once inside the state park, rent a sand saucer and head to the back of the park where you'll find huge 30-foot-tall sand dunes reminiscent of the Sahara Desert. My kids had a blast surfing the big dunes and climbing the sand hills. 2) Hike the South Prong Canyon

On an expedition to discover a trade route from San Antonio to Santa Fe, Spanish explorer José Mares first discovered this canyon and named it Sangre de Cristo (Blood of Christ). Over 200 years later, it's still easy to see how he came up with the name. In the South Prong Canyon of the Little Red River in Caprock Canyons State Park, you'll be treated to the sight of deep red canyon walls stippled with veins of white gypsum rock. This long, narrow canyon sports a hiking trail that leads to a primitive campsite that's a mile from the parking area. For the adventurous, walk past the primitive campsite and continue on the 8-mile canyon loop trail. Along the way you're bound to see native wildlife like mule deer and armadillos and geologic wonders like giant sandstone spires that jut from the canyon floor.

3) See a Palo Duro Sunrise

When the sunlight spills over the eastern rim of Palo Duro Canyon, the chasm comes alive. Deep red and yellow canyon walls almost glow in technicolor brilliance as the sun warms the 250-million-year-old canyon. This wide-open country is an inspiration to artists and is equally inspiring to casual visitors. For a leisurely morning stroll, walk the short distance to Capitol Peak and photograph the big canyon wall lit with the brilliance of a new sun. For the more adventurous, start out at least an hour before sunrise and hike all the way to Palo Duro's most famous spire - The
