> Nomination forms will be publicly available Nov. 23, 2011, at peanut buying point locations and Texas AgriLife Extension Service offices in the counties listed above, or they can be requested by mail directly from TPPB at 4205 N. I-27, Lubbock, Texas 79403. If you request a nomination form by mail from TPPB, please include your county of residence. Nomination applicants must reside in a county within a TPPB voting region where they seek nomination and must have their application signed by the applicant and 10 other eligible voters. A form must be filed with TPPB no later than Dec. 23, 2011, in order for it to be valid.

A person is eligible to vote in this board election if he or she is currently a producer of peanuts, or for at least one production period during the three years preceding the date of this election (Jan. 23, 2012), has been a producer of peanuts or has caused peanuts to be produced for commercial purposes. This includes owners of farms and their tenants or sharecroppers that pay the peanut assessment. Any person qualified to vote is also qualified to seek nomination for election to the board as a director. For a producer to vote in director elections, the producer must reside within a county located in the voting region they wish to





This week my story is probably short and sweet, but I've been able to get out very little, but soon I will have more.



This Thanksgiving season, let's take a positive step. Let's remember to thank God for the blessing of our own individual "Promised Land."


