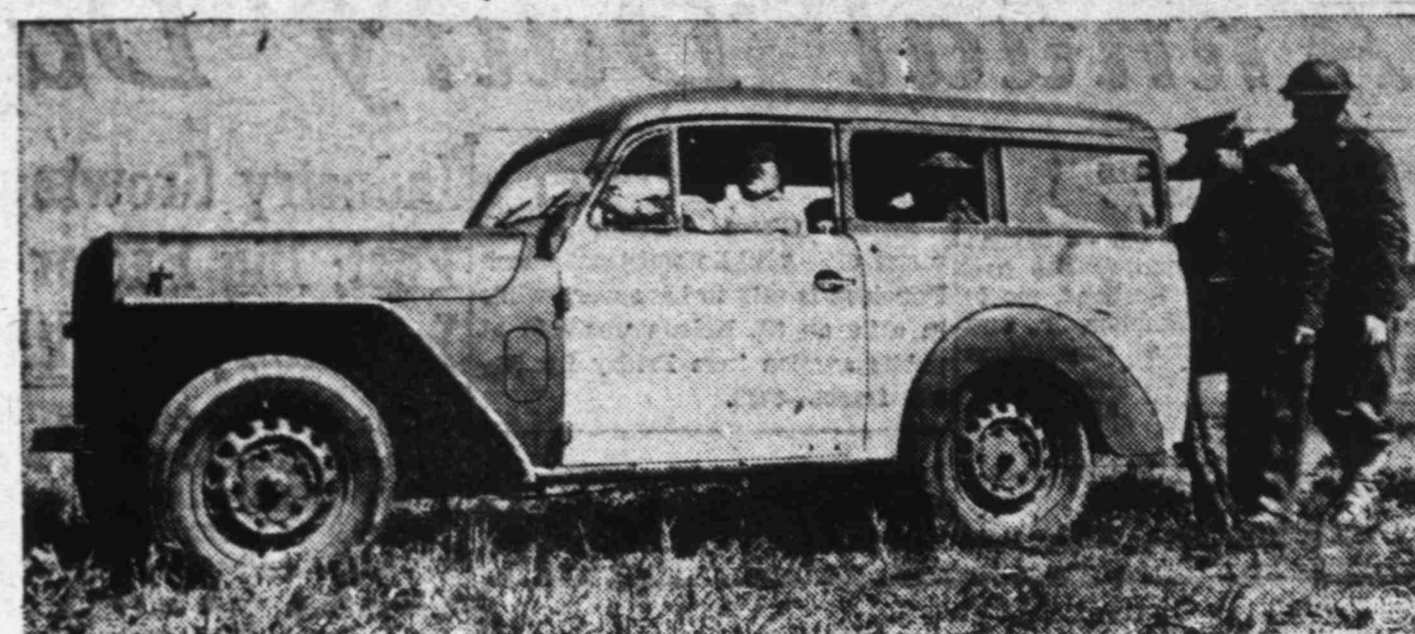

Dairying has brought another development, too, that of the feed growing farmer, and that market has in itself become a big money crop for the county and area.

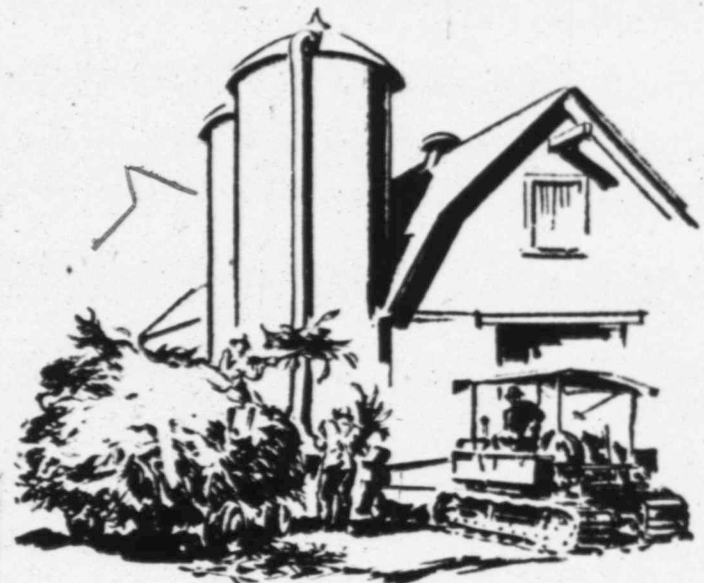

The President's action was made public by the White House Saturday in an exchange of letters showing the plan had been worked out by Attorney General Biddle, War Secretary Stimson, Navy Secretary Knox and Thurman Arnold, assistant attorney general in charge of anti-trust prosecutions.

McKENNEY ON BRIDGE

This is the last of a series of six articles on the correct response to the opening lead.

America's Card Authority
Defensive play, especially as to the choice of card to play after the suit is decided, is full of conventions. These are agreements as to what to do in standard situations, so defenders can tell each other about their holdings.

To false card is to make a play in violation of a convention. Most false cards are made by playing an unnecessarily high card. The object is to deceive the declarer. On the road to expertise in contract, there is a stage where the player, having seen the occasional efficacy of a false card, takes every opportunity to do so.

Most of the time he fails to affect the declarer's play in any way, but keeps his partner guessing, especially if they are good players who can make elaborate inferences from slight indications.

A good rule to follow is not to false card unless you can see that deceiving the declarer is likely to be advantageous, and that the possible deception of your partner probably will not spoil the defense.

Today's hand shows a clear case of judicious false-carding. Dummy plays low on the opening lead. Now the contention is to play the king from East's holdings. But why should East gratuitously inform the declarer as to the location of both high honors?

Declarer will assume West has not underled the ace. If East shows the king, declarer will know his only chance to win a spade trick is to finesse against West for the jack. The right play by East is the ace.

Declarer will then have to guess whether to play the queen or the 10 on the second round of the suit. True, he may guess right, but nothing is lost by trying.

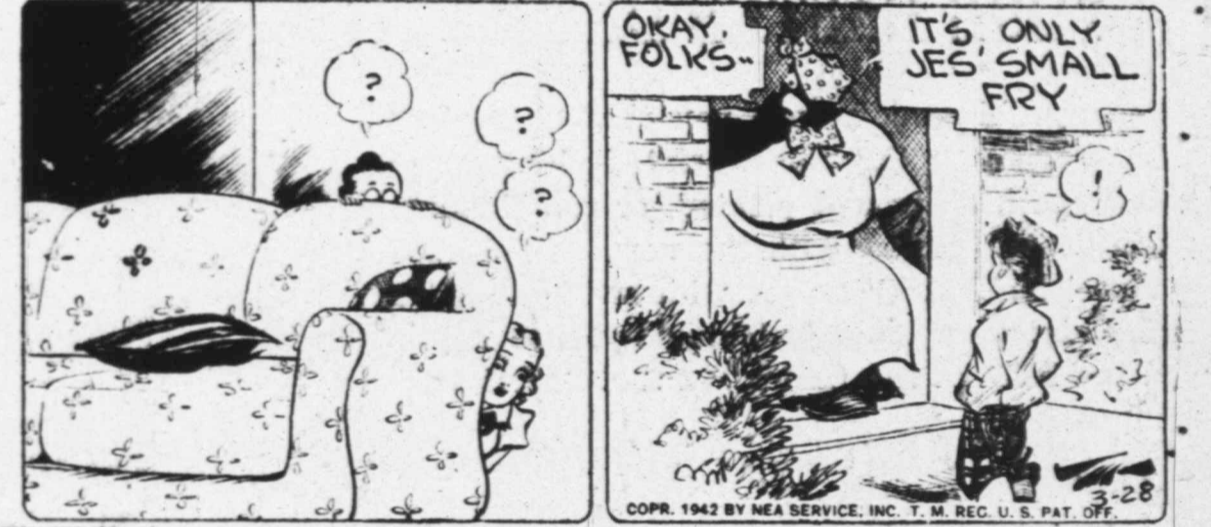

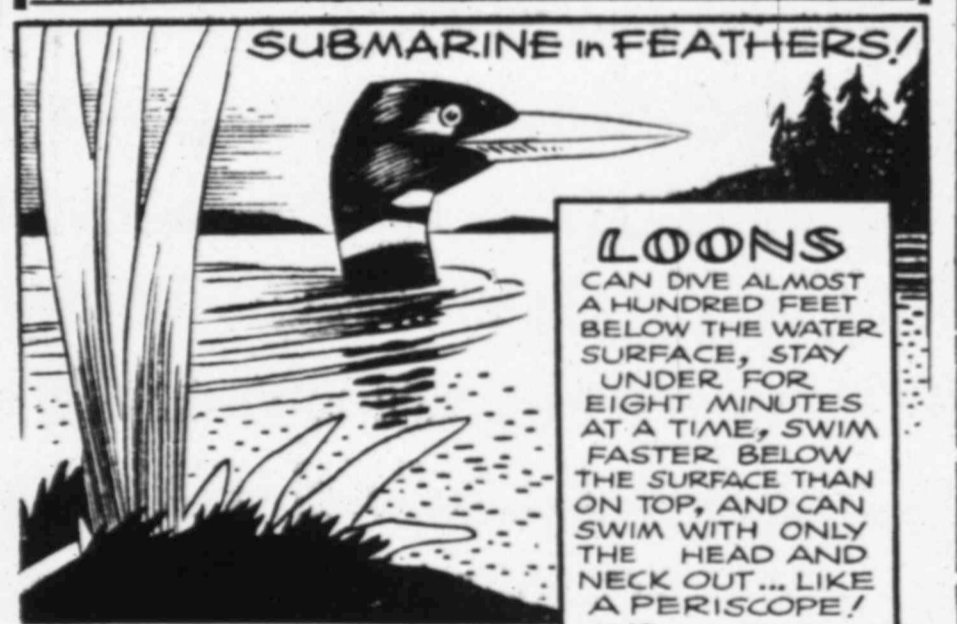
