Broken; Reds Near Kharkov

American Tanks Lead Red Army In Smashing Drive Through Lines

Associated Press War Editor Led by American-made tanks, Marshal Semeon Timoshenko's armies were reported to have advanc-ed seven miles beyond the Donets River Friday in their big offensive against Kharkov, the Soviet "Pittsburgh", after smashing more than 150 German tanks in two days.

The Red Army recaptured a number of nearby communities and forced the Germans into retreat after brushing aside counter-attacks in which the Nazis vainly threw in their reserves, front-line dispatches reported.

Diplomatic sources in London said they had heard that Adolf Hitler was so taken aback by the unexpected power of the Soviet attack that he had instructed his ambassador to Tokyo to increase pressure on Japan for an attack on Russia.

The argument to Japan was said to be that Russia had concentrated so much on the European front that she could offer little resistance to an attack against Siberia.

Despite bad weather which hampered tank and aerial operations, the Russians deepened their penetration of the Nazi positions and advanced over roads littered with hundreds of German bodies and many smashed tanks and cannon, said Red Star, official Army paper.

It described the whole continuing operation as "another heavy defeat" for the Germans who have held the important Ukranian steel

BERLIN (From German Broadcasts.)—The German high command announced Friday that its air force, flung into battle on the Arctic supply line to Russia, had destroyed a United States cruiser and destroyer as well as a 3,000ton icebreaker and a 2,000-ton merchant vessel.






