General MacArthur's Headquarters, Australia (AP)-By a series of outflanking movements, Japanese troops have fought their way across the summit of the rugged Owen Stanley Mountains in New Guinea and are pushing down the southern slope within 44 miles airline of Port Moresby, General MacArthur's Headquarters announced Thursday.

Australian forces, the announcement said, are battling gallantly to halt the enemy advance along a narrow trail traversing a series of ridges which still lie between the invaders and their goal.

The fighting is proceeding under conditions of "extraordinary hardship and difficulty," the bulletin added. Allied air units were sald to be playing an important role in the






