have enough men to do the fighting, manufacture the armament and munitions of war, raise the food, and

Yet in the single city of New York there are sup posed to be almost half a million men and women who want work they cannot find. And in California a scandal
is brewing because iarge war plants are hoarding men whose services they cannot use, as insurance against the Aside from the shortage of skilled workers, which is a different problem involving training and upgrading,
the manpower crisis is a direct result of malditribution.
