Russians Tightly Hem Main Base For German Armies At Stalingrad

Adolf Hitler's cry for "living space" echoed with terrible urgency for 22 German Divisions on the Soviet front Tuesday as the Russians stormed within three miles of Kotelnikovski, 90 miles southwest of Stalingrad, and thrust within 45 miles of a junction with Red Army troops driving across the Middle Don Steppes toward Rostov.

Dispatches said Kotelnikovski, which served as a main base for the Nazi siege armies before Stalingrad, was now hemmed tightly on three sides, and the Soviet command announced:

"The enemy is sending special detachments to cover up the retreat of his troops."

Insiders concede that legislation is desirable if war Findustry's manpower problems are to be solved effectively. But they would rather not talk about that now.

It is contended that if the probability of legislation is denied by responsible officialdom, then enough persons will respond voluntarily so that the need for legislation may be deferred.
