Associated Press War Editor
Soviet dispatched declared Tuesday that vavering German troops had retreated another 20 miles on the eastern approaches to Rostov, while on the Lower Don front the Nazi high cominfantry into a desperate new attempt to hal the Red armies.

Once again, a series of brilliant Russian strokes overshadowed the news from other fronts in the global war. There were Allied bombing attacks on the Italian port of Naples and on Hitler's high command acknowledged that Re Russians were keeping up the offensive in hree major sectors, reporting tersely: "Between the Caucasus and the Don, in the area of Stalingrad and the Don area, the Russians again attacked in the same focal points as before with strong forces
