Live Incomes Or Dead Assets

Undoubtedly the best answer given to those who talk about a \$10,000,000,000 loss to the government if the Ruml pay-as-you-earn income tax proposal is adopted was Mr. Ruml's own.

His plan would benefit the Treasury, Mr. Ruml contends, by substituting live income for dead assets.

It is the money in one's pockets that pays for purchases not the "accounts due."

Perhaps by accident—though it would appear to be by deliberate intent—the Ruml plan has been made to appear complicated. It is not. The many half-considered alternatives are. But the Ruml plan itself is so simple that any taxpayer can understand it.

public opinion wins this tax war—we taxpayers will have income tax payments deducted weekly from our envelopes or other sources of income.

March 15, 1944, and annually thereafter, we will report to the Treasury on our year's income. Most of the tax will have been paid. If there is a balance due, either way, the adjustment will be made.

That is all there is to it. The rest is a mass of complications, introduced either to before the issue or from honest inability to see through a clearcut proposal.

To avoid windfalls—to see that high income persons do not profit from the setting ahead of the tax clockwhen such a person dies there would be a special death tax to recover what otherwise might have been lost.

The public understands these things. Otherwise the public would not be so nearly unanimous in its demand that the Ruml plan be adopted

The public realizes that few persons can pay two years' taxes from one year's income. 

Meatless Wednesdays On 1794 Ration List

WASHINGTON -(AP)- When the American Navy was a fledgling ten vears before its successful war on the pirates of Tripoli—the first Navy Ration Law of 1794 provided for meatless Wednesdays.

The authorized ration was 1/2 pound of rice, 4 ounces of cheese, 4 ounces of molasses or 2 ounces of butter, one pound of seabiscuit or hardtack and a pint of rum or one quart of beer per man.

On other days sailors also enjoyed salt meat, without the benefit of refrigeration, and dried beans or peas or potatoes and turnips if they

Social Security Coverage For Men In Service Asked

WASHINGTON -(P)- Extension of Social Security coverage to members of the armed forces as well as to millions of others now outside the program will be recommended by the Social Security Board.

Informed sources reported Monday that adoption of this recommendation, along with other board suggestions for expansion of the program to provide hospitalization costs and cash benefits to disabled workers , might obviate any need for special veterans' legislation like that which followed the last war. Many Bills Pending

A number of bills proposing extension of Social Security coverage to members of the fighting services are pending in Congress, and the security board's recommendations probably will be made in its annual report, expected soon.

There has been little pressure for

speedy adoption of such legislation, however, because men now in the services and their dependents are protected in many ways by laws enacted for the veterans of other These laws, among other things, provide for payments to dependents

in case of death, and to the fighting men themselves for disability incurred in the line of duty. Varied Status




