Confusion Reigns In Mareth Sector

LONDON—(AP)—Prime Minister Churchill told the House of Commons Wednesday that the Germans by counterattacks had regained the greater part of the bridgehead driven through the Mareth Line by the Eighth Army and that the main defense line of the Axis was now largely restored.

Basing a brief statement on the latest information from Tunisia, the Prime Minister said the battle of Tunisia had not yet reached its climax and that much hard fighting was still ahead for British and American troops. "I do not wish that hopes of an easy decision should

be encouraged," he warned, "on the other hand I have great confidence in the final result."

Captain Darrell Welch Is Credited With Downing Nazi Messerschmitt

Captain Darrell G. Welch of Midland was credited Wednesday by Allied headquarters in North Africa with downing one of three German Messerschmitt fighters during an American raid on Bizerte. Flying Fortresses raiding the docks at Bizerte were accompanied by Lightning escorts.

Captain Welch left for overseas service in June, 1942, and has since been awarded the air medal with three oak leaf clusters and the distinguished flying cross for his participation in the fighting in North Africa. He also has been recommended for two oak leaf clusters to accompany the distinguished flying cross.

No other details of the actions in which he has participated have been received here.

He resided in Midland about ten years, and is a graduate of Midland High School. He received his commission in the air corps at Barksdale Field on May 31, 1941.

LONDON ----(AP)--- The German-controlled Oslo radio reported Wednesday that a group of saboteurs had been landed on the Norwegian coast by British motorboats but had been spotted at once by German troops and driven off with sharp losses.




