This does not rule out heavy naval and air blows this spring or summer — blows for which both Army and Navy have been marshalling and organizing their forces for several months. But it would seem to eliminate for the time being any likelihood of decisive actions taken on American initiative. Inquiries prompted by recent apprehensive statements from Australia about the massing of Japanese ground and air units in the Southwest Pacific brought this general summary of the Pacific situation from highly placed spokes-

The monsoon season is at hand in Burma and with its beginning all important fighting ceases. Not being under pressure in Burma, the Japanese almost certainly will shift some air units from there into their island arc opposite Northern Australia.

There already has been a marked increase in enemy air strength in the Southwest Pacific but it is significant that in both attacks the Japanese were outclassed if not outnumbered and lost much more heavily than our forces.

Jap Air Power Wanes Belief in responsible quarters here is that despite their best efforts at replacement, the Japanese now have an air force numerically inferior to that with which they started the war. Only a fraction of their aircraft carrier fleet is left whereas the comparable United States force is being steadily built up.







WASHINGTON-(A)-The peoples of the little countries the world over had authoritative assurance Thursday that the United States will continue to champion the rights the small nations.

Secretary of State Cordell Hull made this clear in an address before the Pan-American Union Wednesday night in which he vigorously advocated world-wide adoption of the good neighbor policy as a sort of global Magna Charta of the na-

Amid the clash of arms and confusion of world conflict it is more than ever important, he said, "to keep clearly before mankind the principles to which we have dedicated ourselves,"—the principles of sovereignty, equality, law, order, justice, morality, non-intervention, friendliness and cooperation on which the solidarity of this hemisphere is based. Statement Important

"These principles upon which we have built our inter-American life," he emphasized, "are no exclusive property of the continents of the Americas. They are not peculiar to this hemisphere. They are universally applicable and are open to universal adoption

The liberty that we jealously safeguard as the right of every American nation, great and small, is the same liberty which we believe should be established throughout the earth.'

Hull's words were regarded as of particular significance in view of recent British and American official utterances widely interpreted as meaning the small states must reconcile themselves to a diminshed role in the postwar world and that some of them might have to disappear as sovereign entities.



WASHINGTON-(AP)- A behindthe-scenes struggle between the Navy Department and the War Shipping Administration for control over the auxiliary ship construction program was disclosed Thursday by the House naval committee in re-commending 1,000,000 tons of new

In a formal report, the committee said "it has been proposed that the Navy not build this type of ship in the future but that it be built or acquired solely by Maritime Commission and made available to the Navy."

Changes Dangerous The committee asserted such change in policy "at this time would be catastrophic," that it would make the Navy Department a "pensioner" of the War Shipping Administration, and prevent Congress from filling Navy needs "in an orderly man-

Meanwhile, it was learned that the Navy presented to the budget bureau its request for the 1,000,000 tons of auxiliary vessels, and was turned down with notice that the shipping administration would get the money and authority to build
