The first teacher of the school was Miss Ollie Norris of Haskell and the next teacher was Fred Sanders who was a young man at that time and starting out in life. He is today one of our progressive gin men of the city. A school has been taught every year since the district was established and it has progressed with the years as they came In 1922 the Howard and the Whitt

hapel schools were consolidated and the new building erected on the new location where it now stands and the Whitt Chapel school building was purchased by the Methodist people for a church biulding and the Baptist murchased the Howard school building for their church and both churches are in progress today.
