These figures are based upon an average of 11000 miles per year according to the American Motorists Association. These mortality figures are based upon replacement data furnished by automobile manufacturers. The cost per mile is computed from detailed cost accounting records covering 800 typical automobiles operated in various parts of the United States.

The largest single item in the composite average automobile, for both four and six cylinder machines was maintanance, followed in both types by depreciation, and gasoline consumption. The following is a comparison of the operation costs of the average medium four and


The above figures are computed on a mileage of 11000 miles per ear, getting an average of 17.53 miles per gallon of gasoline for the cylinder car.
