# New Allied Landing In North Solomons Reported By Japan

A new Allied landing operation in the Northern Solomons was announced by the Japanese radio Thursday while Gen. Douglas MacArthur reported a continuance of relentless aerial strikes against Rabaul and Kahili, the disintegrating centers of enemy air power in the

An unconfirmed broadcast in English from Tokyo said Allied forces landed early Wednesday on Mono (Treasury) Island, 20 miles southwest of Shortland Island. Attacking Nipponese naval planes claimed the sinking of one American warship and the damaging of t the sinking of one American warship and the damaging of another. Admr. William F. Halsey's South Pacific Command made no mention of landing operations or damages, although acknowledging Treasury Island was hit during raids on neighboring Kahili, Kara and Ballale airdromes. Significantly, naval censors permitted front-line dispatches to say that Treasury was defended by Japanese artillerymen prepared to guard the sea lanes approaching Bougainville to the northwest.

Halsey's Solomons air force has poured 500 tons of bombs on Bougainville and Ballale in four days. Meanwhile, MacArthur's flyers smashed 58 more enemy planes on the ground and in the air over Rabaul Monday. Forty-three others were severely damaged, bringing the here Thursday. toll of enemy aircraft destroyed or damaged at the big New Britain base since Oct. 12 to 525 planes.

The Central Pacific seemed ripe for new American offensive action to keep advances in line with progress in both North and South Pacific theaters. Assistant Navy Secretary Ralph Bard predicted more carrier task force raids and even landings to draw the Japanese navy out to Rankin by Spring.

## Shipping Men Plan

Sixty-one American-flag steamship companies, organized in the American Merchant Marine Institute, have promulgated a post-war program that is creating much interest in shipping circles. Comment is both favorable and unfavorable, but certainly the program offers a good basis for intelligent discussion.

The institute proposes ultimate transfer of all government-owned merchant ships to private ownership. This will ereate some controversy, although in a nation devoted to the thesis of private enterprise it would seem to be a very reasonable suggestion.

It is suggested that service be restored on established sea routes promptly and progressively, in order to lose no ground; that new routes opened up by war developments be exploited; that American vessels be placed on ments be exploited; that American vessels be placed on former trade routes of the Axis powers; that our coastwise and intercoastal fleet be modernized and expanded; and that we branch out in indirect and "tramp" shipping.

Such steps inevitably would strengthen the position of American lines in foreign trade by enabling us to carry a greatly increased share of our foreign commerce. They would give employment opportunities for our large seagoing personnel. They should be taken in collabora-

tion with our maritime allies. This leaves one other major recommendation which, whether or not it should be accepted intact, concerns a mater of vital national policy. The institute suggests that for national defense purposes. These craft, it is suggested, should be laid up and "sterilized"—that is, they should not be used in competition with private operators—perat least five million tons of shipping be reserved as a pool haps in the Great Lakes, where they would not deteriorate as in salt water.

## Operation Of New Dairy Subsidies Plan Explained

Operation of the dairy feed payment program for the last quarter f 1943 has been explained in a etter to Midland County farmers by W. E. Pigg, chairman of the Midland County AAA committee.

The program is designed to offet a part of the increased cost of dairy production which has become erious in areas where a high perentage of feed has to be purchased and where labor costs have risen

Payment at a rate of 40 cents per hundredweight for whole milk, five cents per pound for butterfat, and four cents per pound for butter will be made by the committee direct to the producers presenting satisfactory evidence of sales, Pigg said. Milk statements or sales receipts issued by cooperatives, dairies, creameries and others, showing the amount of whole milk or butterfat burchased, the date of purchase, and the names of the seller and buyer will be considered satisfactory evidence of sales.




