The Senate, with a one-two punch at unessential spending and further centralization of government, has scored a technical knockout over the Educational Finance Bill by sending it back to languish in committee. This bill was the latest version of a proposed federal subsidy of public schools that has been floating around for the past half-dozen years. It would have turned over to the state an annual appropriation of \$300,000,000, two-thirds of which would have gone to raise teachers salaries, and the remainder "more nearly to equalize educational opportunities.
