### New Watchdogs

If the \$30,000 which the Senate recently voted itself pays off according to its promise, we might actually behold the spectacle of the hard-pressed taxpayers inviting the legislators to help themselves to some more. For this modest sum (governmentally speaking) will be used for hiring experts to analyze the appropriations requested by federal agencies, and to check on how these appropriations are spent. That is a job that conceivably is necessary any time, certainly necessary at our rate of wartime spending, and particularly so since Congress seems committed to a policy of tight tax economy.

Of course, we have some experts and fiscal watchdogs already functioning. There is the Bureau of the Budget, for instance. But that is an executive department setup, and while that fact doesn't minimize the good work it is doing, it does make it unsuitable for legislative purposes. There is also the Office of Comptroller General which is Congress's baby. But this organization is more concerned with totting up the accounts when the money is spent than in checking on the correct and economical expenditure.

There are a couple more groups of researchers who ferret out facts for the congressional tax-drafting bodies. But they can scarcely be considered adequate to a thorough checkup on a national budget that runs to \$100 billion a year.

It might be argued, of course, that the forthcoming Senate experts will only duplicate the work of other groups now in operation, and that it might wind up as a case of the watchdogs watching each other. But it is a chance worth taking. Certainly the senators, or representatives either, cannot be expected to do all the spade work themselves. All of the government's war-born bureaus are rightly committed to winning their part of the war at any cost. But many of them are inclined to go overboard. It is only human to exaggerate the importance of your pet theories, to feel that your job is vital, and your gospel the only way to salvation. But it doesn't help to reduce the biggest national debt in world history.



### Shanghai Now Is City Of Fear And High Living Costs By RUSSELL BRINES

PORT ELIZABETH, UNION OF SOUTH AFRICA -(A)- Shanghai ence one of the world's brightest spots, now is a city of fear, shortages and astronomical living costs under the Japanese - dominated Chinese administration.

Ostensibly the Japanese turned over the international settlement and the French concession to the Nanking government last August. In doing so they handed the Chinese puppets the biggest administrative headache in Asia—a restless city of more than 3,000,000 with unsurmountable problems of food supply, rationing and growing shortages of all essentials.

The Chinese were saddled with a paper currency so worthless that even the coolies distrust it. However, the Japanese failed to loosen their actual control of the city, continuing of occupy all major governmental departments.

Outwardly, Shanghai still is the gayest city in the Orient and is a mecca for thousands of Japanese militarists and civilians who hope to garner a few crumbs of remaining profits while tasting the most comfortable life in Asia.

Night clubs, dance halls and theaters still are operating and sporting events. Hotels, restaurants and bars are full. Shops and department stores are doing business, and the streets are filled with rickshas, bicycles, charcoal-burning buses and a few automobiles. Con-servation of electric power has dimmed the usually brilliant skyline. The Japanese attempt to emphasize the realities of war through extensive air raid drills.

Otherwise, war has only slightly touched the surface of Shanghai's face. The city was undamaged during the occupation and continued a relatively normal life for many

Now shortages of rice, sugar cooking oil and other essentials are becoming acute, particularly for the The ration lines grow longer and more unruly. Costs of many necessities are several hundred times normal.
