The Office of Price Administration district rent director has requested the Board of Labor Statistics in Washington to make a complete survey of rental conditions in Midland. One the result of this survey will
determine whether the OPA will extend Federal rent control to Midland and determine whether the OPA will
establish an enforcing office here.

If this is done, at least five persons will be sent to Midland and the office expense probably will exceed $\$ 8,000$ a year. Such expense must be met by the toxpayers of our government.

But complaints from Midland on rent increases and profiteering are increasing. Perhaps 15 to 20 per cent of the tenants here are paying excessive rents.

The OPA was formed to prohibit such practices and if an enforcing office is established here the violators will be prosecuted and all complaints will result in investigations,

Under the law, tenants may sue for triple damages when landlords are convicted of profiteering. Complaints will be filed in Federal court and the law provides for no exemptions. Technical violations of the law concerning improvements, defined as maintenance by the OPA but considered capital improvements by landlords, will be investigated and not permitted.
